

The Provincial Proficiency Scale

If your child is in Grades K-9, you won't see letter grades on their report card. Instead, you will see information on where your child is on the Provincial Proficiency Scale. The scale uses the terms "Emerging," "Developing," "Proficient," and "Extending" to describe student learning. The scale maintains high standards for student learning.

What about the scale?

Emerging

'Emerging' indicates that a student is just beginning to demonstrate learning in relation to the Learning Standards of the curriculum but is not yet doing so consistently. Emerging isn't failing.

Students who are not yet demonstrating any learning in relation to the Learning Standards can be assessed as 'Emerging'.

If this is due to insufficient evidence of learning, the student can be assigned an "IE".

Developing

'Developing' indicates that a student is demonstrating learning in relation to Learning Standards with growing consistency; The student is showing initial understanding but still in the process of developing their competency in relation to the Learning Standards of the curriculum.

Developing isn't failing. All students will be developing in some areas and specific time

Proficient

'Proficient' is the goal for students.
It is when a student
demonstrates the expected
learning in relation to the
Learning Standards of the
curriculum

'Proficient' is not synonymous with perfection. Instead, the student is able to demonstrate their learning consistently or most of the time.

Extending

'Extending' is not synonymous with perfection. 'Extending' is a student demonstrating learning, in relation to Learning Standards, with increasing depth and complexity.

'Extending' is not a bonus, or a reward, and does not necessarily require that students do a greater volume of work or work at a higher grade level.

'Extending' is not the standard for all students, 'Proficient' is. Therefore, if students turn in all their work and demonstrates evidence of learning in all Learning Standards for the given area of learning, they are not automatically assigned 'Extending'.

Did you know that there's a faster, easier way to recycle your refundable beverage containers – without sorting or waiting in line?

Return-It Express lets you drop off your containers in minutes. Here's how:

- 1) If you don't already have a free Return-It Express account, scan the box with your phone or click the link get the app and sign-up.
- 2) Bag your unsorted empty beverage containers in see through bags. (Up to 90-litres)
- 3) Bring up to 6 bags at a time to any Return-It Express depot. All the local depots offer Express, I checked!
- 4) Walk in with your bags. At the kiosk, type in your phone #, peel and stick the printed labels to your bags
- 5) Drop the bags in the Express bin and walk away.

You get the full refund value, just like manual sorting, and less...sticky hands.





REGISTERING FOR PROGRAMS OF CHOICE

Early and Late French Immersion for September 2026

Apply on the main page of SD43 website, between January 8, 2026 at 9:00am to January 14, 2026 at 4:00pm.

- Children with siblings in a Program of Choice must still apply online.
- Siblings will be given priority if the older sibling is in the program of choice in September 2025.
- Applications will be processed on a RANDOM DRAW BASIS.

Early and Late Montessori for September 2026

Apply on the main page of our website between January 8, 2026 at 9:00am to January 14, 2026 at 4:00pm.

Students currently in Grade 5 Montessori and interested in continuing must still apply online and will be given priority over new applications.

- Children with siblings in a Program of Choice must still apply online.
- Applications will be processed on a RANDOM DRAW BASIS.

CROSS CATCHMENT PROCESS

Parents sometimes wish for their children to attend a school that is not their catchment school. In such cases, a Cross Catchment Application is required after registering at their catchment school. School District 43 uses a random draw process for Cross Catchment Applications (using in-district priority, then out-of-district).

If enrolment projections show that space is available, Cross Catchment transfer Applications will be accepted in accordance with the following priorities:

- (i) sibling of a child who will be in attendance at the Cross Catchment school in the following year;
- (ii) a child residing within the SD43 residential boundaries (could include private or homeschool) and
- (iii) non-school district resident child.

The **School Locator** tool on the district web site provides a student's designated catchment area schools. **Catchment is based on permanent home address that is currently on record with the school.**

There are two separate applications:

- 1) Kindergarten Cross Catchment- Kindergarten students must first register with their catchment school.
- 2) Grades 1-12 Cross Catchment (including a section to confirm sibling status)

To apply for Cross Catchment:

Apply on the main page of the SD43 website, starting Friday, Feb 6, 2026 at 9 a.m. to Wednesday, Feb 11, 2026 at 4 p.m.

- Applications will be processed based on the availability of space in schools and on a **RANDOM DRAW PROCESS**. (using in-district priority then out-of-district)
- The application requires student or Personal Education Number (PEN) number (can be obtained from your child's school), child's birth date, home address, name of current or assigned school, and the name of the requested school(s). Kindergarten requests do not need to provide the student number/ PEN number.
- Families will be notified by district email of the outcome in the second week of March.



THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI) IS COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL IN JANUARY/MID-MARCH!

SD43 - Coquitlam has once again partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.


Grades 4 & 8 students are invited to complete the MDI during <u>class time</u> between: January 13th and March 13th, 2026.
