For Your Consideration- Reflecting on who we are.

Montgomery has a long history of restorative practises (RP), it is one of the core beliefs that drives how we interact with each other. An important step in righting a wrong involves students meeting together with an adult facilitator and owning their mistake and setting it right. Restorative Practice does not mean that consequences are not part of the learning process.

An often less known and understood component of restorative practice is student agency. It is the belief or value that students should have an authentic voice in shaping their school community and be able to impact change. The class charters, which all classes completed in the fall, was one example of student voice. Charters represent students' collective commitment to themselves and each other by describing how they want their classroom/ school to function.

Our four indigenous leadership students and district student advisory council with 18 Monty members represent our school interests at the district level and work with our school-based student government to support the district initiatives that both district leadership groups undertake.

Each advisory class is also represented by one or two of their classmates on the Montgomery Student Government, which is sponsored by me, Mrs. Husband, and Mrs. Hamnet. Student government meets weekly to develop their leadership skills, support and create student events and gather student input to make improvements at Monty. So far this year, Student Government, promoted and helped to organize the Winter Market and raised money for Share Food bank through the selling of Candy Cane Grams and will be supporting the upcoming Multicultural Lunch.

Last school year we began a school revisioning process with the help of Katrina Thorsen, an experienced facilitator and artist. Katrina met with students and staff separately to collect their input about the strengths and needs of our school and to explore a new mission statement, school mascot (Mariners) and our school logo (a hammer head shark). The name Montgomery Mariners was created during the change from a Jr. Secondary to Middle level in the late 1990's. Prior to that we were the Monty Trojans.

The new mission statement as well as the new team names (Team Rockies, Les Alpes, Team Cascades and Team Atlas) are the result of this work. The large canvas banners in the gym and main hallway are a visual summary of this collective work. We are currently in the process of creating a new school logo and mascot. Prior to the break students were invited to share their ideas in any format and we had 15 entries. We look forward to sharing the outcome of this work with you in the Spring.



Report Cards -Now Available

On December 18th report cards and updated IEPs became available online. If you have not done so, please take time with your child to read through the report card. There is a lot of writing in each report. The areas that are specific to your child are,

1. Student perspective
2. Teacher comments
3. Collaborative Goals and Next Steps

Teachers complete reports cards in MyEd which is the provincial student information system. Using this system ensures that student data is securely stored and creates a record in a system that is used by most districts throughout B.C. All courses are embedded into the report card and are assessed using a proficiency scale and comment rather than a letter grade. Effective September 2023 all reporting for K-9 in B.C. uses a proficiency scale.



Multicultural Lunch

We are planning our Annual **Multicultural Lunch on Friday, February 20th, 2026**. This event has been a highlight for many students.

For the Multicultural lunch students bring food to share from their heritage or families donate money (\$12 is recommended) and we purchase food from many cultures (Italian, Indian, Chinese and Japanese). Parent volunteers organize and serve the food at one of 4 food stations. Students will eat in the gym so that we can eat as an entire school community. Please help us make this meal a community builder.

To reduce our environmental impact, all students need to bring:

- Reusable utensils, plate or bowl and cup
- A bag to carry the clean and dirty dishes to and from home

We will need nearly 40 parent volunteers to make this event possible. A form will be sent out next week with more detailed information. This is a very fun event and is a great opportunity to connect as a community and celebrate multiculturalism at Montgomery.

Did you know that there's a faster, easier way to recycle your refundable beverage containers – without sorting or waiting in line?

[Return-It Express](#) lets you drop off your containers in minutes. Here's how:

- 1) If you don't already have a free Return-It Express account, scan the box with your phone or click the link get the app and sign-up.
- 2) Bag your unsorted empty beverage containers in see through bags. (Up to 90-litres)
- 3) Bring up to 6 bags at a time to any Return-It Express depot. All the local depots offer Express, I checked!
- 4) Walk in with your bags. At the kiosk, type in your phone #, peel and stick the printed labels to your bags
- 5) Drop the bags in the Express bin and walk away.

You get the full refund value, just like manual sorting, and less...sticky hands.





In your Return-It Express account use “**Set Automatic Donation**” to send all future refunds directly to the **Montgomery Middle PAC**.



Winter Weather and School Closures

Schools are not usually closed because of snow or other weather conditions. All schools in the Coquitlam School District will remain open, if possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

Our schools are in very different climate zones from one another and there may be the need for **some** schools to be closed within SD43 while others remain open. If there is a partial closure of schools within the school district, these individual schools will be named. Full or partial school closures do not happen often.

Early and Late French Immersion for September 2026

Apply [on the main page of SD43 website](#), between **January 8, 2026 at 9:00am to January 14, 2026 at 4:00pm**.

- Children with siblings in a Program of Choice must still apply online.
- Siblings will be given priority if the older sibling is in the program of choice in September 2026.
- Applications will be processed on a **RANDOM DRAW BASIS**.

Early and Late Montessori for September 2026

Apply [on the main page of our website](#) between **January 8, 2026 at 9:00am to January 14, 2026 at 4:00pm**.

Students currently in Grade 5 Montessori and interested in continuing must still apply online and will be given priority over new applications.

- Children with siblings in a Program of Choice must still apply online.
- Applications will be processed on a **RANDOM DRAW BASIS**.

CROSS CATCHMENT PROCESS

Parents sometimes wish for their children to attend a school that is not their catchment school. In such cases, a Cross Catchment Application is required after registering at their catchment school. School District 43 uses a random draw process for Cross Catchment Applications (using in-district priority, then out-of-district).

If enrolment projections show that space is available, Cross Catchment transfer Applications will be accepted in accordance with the following priorities:

- (i) sibling of a child who will be in attendance at the Cross Catchment school in the following year;
- (ii) a child residing within the SD43 residential boundaries (could include private or homeschooled) and
- (iii) non-school district resident child.

The **School Locator** tool on the district web site provides a student's designated catchment area schools. **Catchment is based on permanent home address that is currently on record with the school**.

There are two separate applications:

- 1) Kindergarten Cross Catchment- Kindergarten students must first register with their catchment school.
- 2) Grades 1-12 Cross Catchment (including a section to confirm sibling status)

To apply for Cross Catchment:

Apply [on the main page of the SD43 website](#), starting **Friday, Feb 6, 2026 at 9 a.m. to Wednesday, Feb 11, 2026 at 4 p.m.**

- Applications will be processed based on the availability of space in schools and on a **RANDOM DRAW PROCESS**. (using in-district priority then out-of-district)
- The application requires student or Personal Education Number (PEN) number (can be obtained from your child's school), child's birth date, home address, name of current or assigned school, and the name of the requested school(s). Kindergarten requests do not need to provide the student number/ PEN number.
- Families will be notified by district email of the outcome in the second week of March.



THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI) IS COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL IN JANUARY/MID-MARCH!

SD43 - Coquitlam has once again partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.

Grades 4 & 8 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between:
January 13th and March 13th, 2026.
