IMPORTANT HEALTH REMINDERS

Vaccines

Vaccines are important tools to protect against many serious communicable diseases. Vaccination protects from serious illness due to COVID-19 and is the most effective way to reduce the impact of COVID-19 on our communities. All COVID-19 vaccines approved for use in Canada protect against serious complications, including from the omicron variant. It is important to get all recommended vaccine doses to get the most effective protection against serious cases of COVID-19. People 6 months and older are eligible for COVID-19 vaccines. More information about COVID-19 vaccines is available from the BCCDC website. Students and staff are also encouraged to ensure they are up to date on all recommended vaccines for other communicable diseases, including COVID-19 vaccines.

Health Awareness

Staff, parents, caregivers, and students should not come to school if you are sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities. This an important way to keep everyone healthy.

Non-medical masks and face coverings

The decision to wear a mask beyond when it is required by public health is a personal one, based on individual preference.

Respiratory Etiquette

Parents can help teach and reinforce good respiratory etiquette practices among students, including:

- Cough or sneeze into their elbow or a tissue. Throw away used tissues and wash hands.
- Refrain from touching their eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Refrain from sharing any food, drinks, unwashed utensils, cigarettes, or vaping devices.

MONTY SCHOOL ROUTINES

Before school

• Students are expected to wait outside before school. Students can wait in the cafeteria before school without their personal electronic devices' phones. Supervision and breakfast are available from 8am.

Nut break and lunch time.

- Students eat their nutrition break snack outside their classroom and ideally outside (weather permitting). Students have the option to remain inside or go out. Please pack easy to eat snacks.
- Students eat their lunch inside their classroom from 12:40-12:48 and be outside for the remainder of the lunch break (weather permitting). Students who need more time to finish their lunch are given more time but those students who are eager to get outside can do so quickly. There are also many clubs and intramurals to join.

National Truth and Reconciliation Day School Assembly-Monday, September 29th. <u>Please wear orange.</u>

The wearing of orange shirt is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out of *Phyllis' story* of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually.





The date was chosen because it

is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. National Truth and Reconciliation Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools, and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

School News

Online Payments

School expenses including fieldtrips, athletic fees and school events are made through an online payment system that will allow you to view and pay your child's student fees safely and conveniently. This system is used until your child completes gr 12 and is automatically updated when they move to a new SD43 school.

All families need to be registered so please get your account online now! Here's how to get started:

- 2. Click on "Get Started Today"
- 3. Create your account
 - o Enter first and last name; click continue
 - Enter fields: address, phone number, e-mail address: click continue
 - Choose a password and security question
 - o Make sure to OPT IN to receiving e-mail notifications for updated school information

Student Activity Fee \$37.00 This fee includes the student planner, class photo and locker rental as well as school wide activities such as sports day and pancake breakfast/ Camp Monty. This fee should be paid by the end of September. If you family needs assistance with this fee, please email kshorthouse@sd43.bc.ca.

Athletic Fee \$20 for students who play on a school team. This is a yearly **one-time** fee that will cover all teams and all three seasons throughout the year. Students will also have a form to complete which acknowledges their commitment to the Middle School's athletic code of conduct.

Gr. 6 Immunization Days: Friday, March 6th & Friday, May 8th

This is an important event for all Gr. 6 students. Forms will be sent home to all Gr. 6 students to complete for their public health immunizations. Clubs and Volleyball

Many wonderful school teams and clubs will begin quickly. Please encourage your child to come out and join in. Middle Schools in Coquitlam School District have a no cut policy which means that everyone who comes out, attends practices and is a positive member of the team plays...equally.



The cross country (running) team, swimming, fencing and volleyball teams will get started once we have confirmed coaching staff.

Our school clubs and teams are a great way to meet new people and make a new friend.

Important School Expectations

- 1. Closed campus- Montgomery Middle is a closed campus. This means that once students arrive to school in the morning they are expected to remain at school until the end of the day. Families are welcome to sign out and pick up their child for lunch.
- 2. Personal Electronic Devices- We have significantly invested in technology as a school to ensure that students have technology available as a learning tool. Mobile phones/ smart watches use is <u>not permitted</u> inside the school from the start of the day 8:37am until 3pm and will need to be stored in lockers. Phone are also not allowed in the school prior to the start of the day, if they come early for Café Monty.
 - If you need to contact your child, please call the school and we will either have your child return your call or pass the message to them. Texting students during class time (ie. pick up time), interrupts the learning of your child and others when you expect your child to reply. Please talk with your child about your expectations. Students have access to a phone at the office in the event they need to contact you.
- 3. Vaping products- Students are not permitted at any time to use or be in the presence, possession of any alcohol or drugs, (including all vaping and tobacco products). Given that consequences are so significant (usually a formal suspension), families are asked to review this with your child. Vaping has become an epidemic in many schools. While it is not currently a problem at Montgomery we want to work with parents and our students to ensure that Monty continues to be a healthy place to learn.
- 4. E-Bikes and E-Scooters Beginning Sept 2025, Montgomery Middle will be expecting our students and their families to come into compliance with the Provincial Rules regarding e-bikes and e-scooters. BC requires that users be 16 years of age. Candidly students are not using these devices responsibly because they are not developmentally ready and are endangering themselves and others. As a result, e-bikes and e-scooters will not be permitted at Montgomery Middle. Here are links for your reference:



DISTRICT NEWS

New School for Montgomery

Ecole Montgomery Middle School will be replaced with a new building. The Province's \$86.5-million investment will have 600 student spaces and also include the addition of a neighbourhood learning centre, which will offer Indigenous programming. In keeping with the Province's CleanBC emissions-reduction goals, the school will be designed with a greenhouse gas emissions reduction of more than 75% compared to a LEED Gold baseline building. The replacement school is <u>expected</u> to be ready to welcome students and staff in fall 2028. This year the design process will begin this exciting process.
