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McFaul's Chat and Chew: Parent Education – Learning about Transitions

Parent Ed. Community Change Session # 1 – We invite you to attend an evening panel presentation from our alumni students who have volunteered to share their time with you to discuss their insights on high school transitions. Many parents call us throughout the year to discuss their concerns about whose class their child is placed into and about what teachers are the best in preparing their child for the rigors of high school along with the discussion about what secondary school is the best fit for their child. All worthy questions and inquiries; moreover, who best to share some responses but students who have just recently experienced the transition event over the past few months and year. This is your chance as a parent to come and ask direct questions about the following types of information:

1. How did the middle years prepare your for the transition to high school?
2. What were the biggest challenges in the transition to high school in your first few months/ year?
3. What type of impact did having multi-grade experiences in middle have on your transition to high school – positive and negative?
4. What do they like best about their current high school placement and why?
5. How could the middle school experiences better prepare students for the transition to high school?

We will have a panel of students presenting from all academic backgrounds and representing a wide variety of secondary schools in our district. The key questions are; will we have a group of parents who want to get direct information, who want to hear the successes and the challenges of transition and will we have parents who will vote with their feet and attend to try to discover the best fit for high school for their child. If you want to be a part of this process we ask that you show up at **7:00 on Monday Nov. 17th – TOMMORROW NIGHT** to meet our array of fine Gr. 9/10 students who want to tell you about their experiences in transitioning to high school. This is why we call this **PARENT EDUCATION** and how our students our **CHANGING OUR COMMUNITY**. **Are you ready to learn and be part of the change?**

Grade-less Report Cards for Montessori – We will be following forward on a commitment that was established last year in our District Montessori Program to move towards a system wide reporting process of using grade-less report cards. This is not new to the district as both Miller Park Elementary and Scott Creek Middle both completed a year cycle of using a very informative structure of grade-less report cards. The work done by our Montessori teachers and District Support Staff will require more depth and detail in the analysis of student work along with a collaborative approach using self-assessment and consultative reflective practices between student and teacher. We are excited to move in a purely true Montessori direction on enhanced students self-assessment and qualitative examples of student work and progress and a move away from percent and letter grades that often times do not show the quality and quantity of the work portfolios the students have created.

A quote from the **Montessori Foundation**: Traditionally, Montessori schools communicate with parents and future schools about children's progress through written narrative reports and portfolios of children's work, complemented by parent-teacher-student conferences during the school year. Giving children comparative letter or numerical grades violates the basic principle of good Montessori practice. (Tim Seldin 2010)
