McFaul's Chat and Chew: Growing Up Loud

Our students today live in a world foreign to many of us as we reflect back upon our Gr. 6/7//8 experiences. Many students today have access to Smartphones and have lived in a world whereby instant messaging truly does need to be in an instant and not any longer or else impatience grows. We as adults and parents have moved through the growing pains of technology with dial up internet access and its associated sounds. We lived through Napster and peer to peer downloading before there was any social networking structures like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter or Snapchat among others proliferating the social media scene. This rapid growth in social networking and online downloading has been termed "Growing Up Loud" on social media by a U.B.C. professor named Alfred Hermida. For much of this generation the youthful teen's real time information and social interaction is a byte-sized affair in a digital and largely online world, where living out loud in present tense is what constitutes living. Passing thoughts, activities and even meaningful expressions are performed in 140 characters or less, on mobile phone text messages or Twitter. Friends click "like" to show support for their friend's new haircut or to acknowledge the meal that they selected at a restaurant and they took a picture to show their friends. This world of living out loud has changed our views of privacy and friendship. Privacy is now a profile setting on their social media accounts. As a 53 year old dinosaur, my true friends number as a handful whereas, this teen generation view their friends in the thousands. Hence the dilemma is presented, because how can we truly count as friends people that we have not spent time with in a one-to one conversation, how can we think that we can share private photos called "selfies" with someone who has not shared in my emotional highs and lows of talking about who I think is meaningful to me, how can we call one person a friend one minute and then in one second tag a "like" onto someone else's disrespectful comment about that same person for all to see. This presents a challenge for all of our community to help the old and the new build connections to each other that allows all to learn how to live out loud by sharing their experiences and knowledge. By allowing all to unpack the social norms behind the messages and discuss the meanings of loyalty, kindness, modesty, respect, tolerance, self-discipline, compassion, courage, detachment, forgiveness, generosity and honesty. These are the words that need to be taught louder than the internet memes and text messaging idioms that propagate our kid's language. Why, because the previous list of words are the keys to defining a person and we all want to be described out loud in a positive and purposeful manner. Help your kids with their Smartphone etiquette, help them determine how loud they live their lives because remember you are the one who pays the phone bill.

Programs begin the week of Oct. 15th and go until Dec. 9th which will be the last day of programs. For more information please contact.



Go Girls! Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds is a group mentoring program for girls ages 11-14 that focuses on physical activity, balanced eating and self-esteem. The most important goal of the program is to positively shape the lives of girls by helping them build a positive self-image – setting them on a path to reach their full potential.


