#### Ask Me About . . . ?

This is a weekly feature to help promote conversations at home between parents/guardians and their child. #### Our Guiding Inquiry Question for 2017-18

As you know, we have a school-wide inquiry question to help guide our theme of Change for 2017-18. This important guiding question is a structure for student inquiries to develop in term three. On May 30<sup>th</sup> we invite all parents and guardians to our Presentation of Learning event. It is also marked by an early dismissal on our school calendar. Teachers will send home more information from each division in the coming weeks.

#### How do changes impact our world and our lives?

#### After School Supervision

Our supervision schedule for staff concludes at 3:05pm each day. This supervision schedule provides students time to safely begin making their way home by foot, bike, car or bus. Students that are staying for an after-school team or club are safely supervised by the staff leader of that planned event.

If students are waiting for a ride after 3:05pm we require students to wait in the foyer of A Building or in front of the school on the steps of A Building. Similarly, if students are staying after 3:05pm to get help from a teacher or friend, or to work on a project, they are to do so in a classroom, library, or the Youth Lounge.

Please discuss your after-school plans and procedures with your child so there are no surprises. Recently we have had calls that students are not getting home at the expected time, or they are planning to stay at school for extended periods of time without being part of a planned after school event. Please help us reduce the amount of unsupervised time for your son/daughter after school to support their socially responsible choices and positive use of time.

## VP Update:

### Use of Devices for Learning Purposes

Teachers have been reviewing with students what appropriate use of devices such as Pods, iPads, phones and laptops means in the school learning environment. Devices are not used between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 2:50 p.m. except with specific teacher permission and supervision. Students are encouraged to leave their phones at home or in their lockers, password/passcode protected. While on field trips, the same rules apply.

For emergencies and messages for students while at school, the school phone number is 604-461-7384. Our website ([www.moodymiddle.ca](http://www.moodymiddle.ca)) is also a quick spot to check for updates to the calendar, emergencies, and special or school-wide events. Students have access to a phone at the office to contact parents, if necessary, during regular breaks (e.g. nut break and lunch). As the encouragement of fewer distractions for a safe and learning-filled day is key, we have school-based devices that teachers are accessing for students to further their learning.

### Parking and Student Safety

Please note that there are absolutely **no U-turns on Buller Street** and our pylons in front of the school that are carefully put out by Steve each morning will help remind you of this. As our days are brighter, warmer and longer, students are finding different modes of transportation

to school. Being mindful of turning onto a street that is a block or two beyond and obeying our traffic reminders will help to ensure the safety of all our students as they arrive to school and depart from school whether carpooling, biking, walking or wheeling.

We will continue to remind students to cross at the stop sign at St. George Street or the crosswalk at St. Johns Street and encourage you to have this conversation with your children at home, too. Safety first!

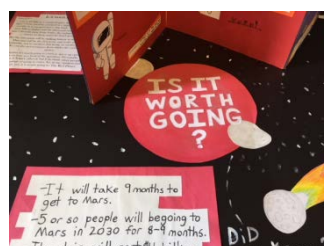

In Wind Pod we are busy preparing for the Moody Middle’s Presentation of Learning scheduled for May 30<sup>th</sup>. Called the Windmills of Change, our project incorporates skills, concepts and ideas from across the entire curriculum and will hopefully inspire both joy and contemplative thought. Poetry, colour theory, science and mathematics will combine in this effort which we hope will move you (and we hope moves itself!).

Our Wind Pod Gallery Walk was a huge success! Students completed the Inquiry Cycle this week by sharing their knowledge on a topic in a variety of ways including models, posters, speeches, stop-motion movies, short film, doodle sketching, PowerPoint and more! The quality of work and amount of effort was impressive!

The Inquiry Process	
Connect & Wonder	Together, students brainstormed a list of possible questions to research during the Earth & Space in-class unit
Investigate	Students researched a question of interest using print materials, web-based text and interviews
Construct	Using notes, students were tasked with completing a zig-zag booklet to share basic vocabulary, general facts, a comparison of 2 or more concepts and a diagram
<b>Express</b>	<b>Students were given the challenge to creatively express their knowledge and share with an audience</b>
Reflect	By thinking back on the process of inquiry, student identified the core competencies and key learnings

### Parenting Wisely Course



Parenting Wisely is a free course about managing the behaviour of elementary school children. Topics include waiting patiently until conversations or phone calls are over, morning and bedtime routines, cooperating with friends and siblings, behaving in public and schoolwork challenges. Two Parenting Wisely courses are being presented by Stan Simular and Porter Street Elementary School.

Our course starts **Tuesday April 17, 2018, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This course will run for 7 consecutive Tuesdays and ends on **May 29, 2018**. A second course starts **Wednesday April 18, 2018, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This course will run for 7 consecutive Wednesdays and ends on **May 30, 2018**.


Both courses will be held at **Porter Street Elementary School, 728 Porter St., Coquitlam**.
