After School Supervision

Our supervision schedule for staff concludes at 3:05pm each day. This supervision schedule provides students time to safely begin making their way home by foot, bike, car or bus. If students are waiting for a ride after 3:05pm we require students to wait in the foyer of A Building or in front of the school on the steps of A Building. Similarly, if students are staying after 3:05pm to get help from a teacher or friend, or to work on a project, they are to do so in a classroom, library, or the Youth Lounge.

Please discuss your after-school plans and procedures with your child so there are no surprises. Recently we have had calls that students are not getting home at the expected time, or they are planning to stay at school for extended periods of time without being part of a planned after school event. Please help us reduce the amount of unsupervised time for your son/daughter after school to support their socially responsible choices and positive use of time.

TRAFFIC PATTERNS ARE CHANGING: Safety Remains #1 Priority

With the new school soon ready for occupancy, we will be revamping the traffic patterns at the start and end of the school day in support of student safety. Please help us by using your common sense and adhering to the signs, our volunteer adult supervisors, and by slowing down in the school zone. Reminding your child(ren) to cross at the crosswalks and stop signs rather than by dashing across the middle of a potentially busy street are critical in getting students to and from school safely. A little extra planning will go a long way to drop off students earlier so that they have ample time to navigate their way through new territory.

Constable DeGoey and his colleagues will be visible in and around school, too. Supporting us through the transition by helping us review our plans for effective and safe drop-offs and pick-up of our students while the new school parking lot continues to be a construction zone, is what will help us navigate through unknown territory as we embrace the changes ahead.

NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN CHANGES UNVEILED - see map!

Please review the map carefully and note that traffic heading southbound between St. George Street and Henry Street on Buller Street will be blocked to traffic when we transition from the current school to the new school. While the date for moving is currently unknown, being prepared for potential changes will help ensure the safety of our students going to and from school.

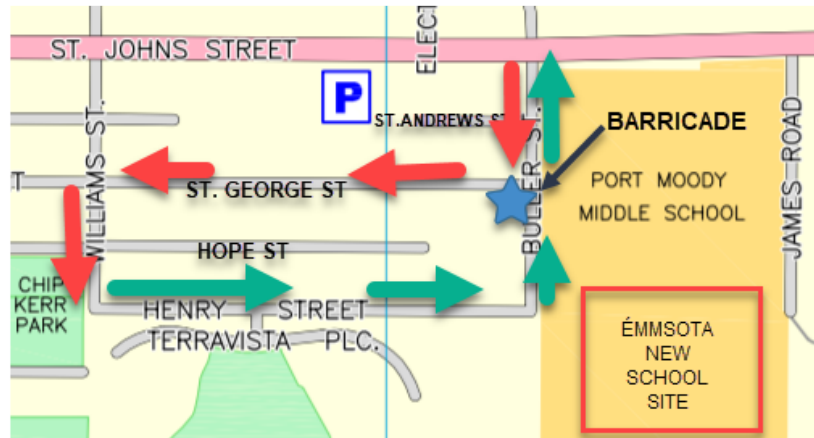
Once we have officially moved, please follow the new traffic pattern changes and loop around the block, westbound on St. George Street, southbound on Williams Street, eastbound on Henry Street and northbound on Buller Street. Pull ahead to allow traffic behind you to also pull over to the right and safely let our students off so they can walk into the school without having to cross over the potentially busy street. Alternatively, students who are dropped off on St. George Street can carefully cross Buller Street at the stop signs, to enter the existing school or the new school with ease, too.

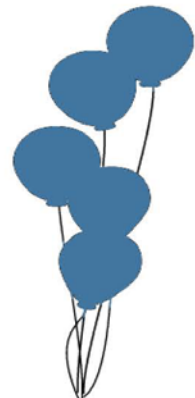
