Recently we have had calls that students are not getting home at the expected time, or they are planning to stay at school for extended periods of time without being part of a planned after school event. Please help us reduce the amount of unsupervised time for your son/daughter after school to support their socially responsible choices and positive use of time.

Student Services Perspective: Raising Resilient Children

Raising resilient youth has been a permanent topic in teachers' professional conversations at EMMSOTA. The question 'How can we support our students to increase their capacity to be successful and overcome obstacles in life?' has been repeatedly at the center of our discussions. Although individuals cannot always control the circumstances and the experiences they encounter in life, resilience research shows that, to a certain extent, resilience can be taught or cultivated. Building resilience in youth at-risk by using a holistic approach was, in fact, the topic of Dr. Martin Brokenleg's presentation at last week's Professional Development day, on February 23rd. The teachers from our school learned that, despite adversity in life, children can thrive when schools create learning environments that foster a spirit of 'belonging' (e.g., creating a school culture in which every child is important), 'mastery' (e.g., setting high expectations for every student and providing opportunities to be successful), 'independence' (e.g., providing opportunities for taking responsibility for own decisions), and 'generosity' (e.g., teaching and experiencing kindness, empathy, apology, forgiveness, and respect). When the need to belong, to be successful, to become independent, and to experience generosity are met, vulnerable children are better able to manage adversity, resist negative influence, and find success in school and life.

All students learned about French Canadian culture, including music and the history of maple syrup and its place in Canadian history. Sampling the maple taffy was a highlight that ended each presentation.

Like everyone else at École Moody Middle, Wind pod students are excited about the fast oncoming spring break! Meantime they are keeping busy with all manner of extracurricular activities around the school including practicing for the upcoming play production (our Wind Pod hallways are alive with song and dance) and athletic endeavours (tales of last nights game echo through the lockers). In the classroom, our grade eights have used their knowledge of Ancient Rome to become event planners by organizing a Feast for the Gods.
