True2You: Empowering Girls Event Wednesday, April 25, 2018

Christine our Youth Worker, and a group of ÉMMSOTA girls attended an incredible workshop yesterday that was hosted by the Port Moody Police Victim Services Unit and Community

Partners. The event was open to girls in grade 4-6 so after announcing the opportunity last week several girls expressed interest and today, were very happy they chose to attend.

Here are a few highlights from the workshop:

The participants got to hear guest presenter Lindsay who is an educator, coach, mentor, consultant, workshop facilitator, and speaker who is passionate about journeying alongside young people as they navigate the challenges of school and life including: identity and social influence, stress and anxiety management, transitions and change, social media and screen obsession and addiction, and the executive functioning skills. Lindsay's presentation is called **Bold New Girls: Total empowerment and Boldness** - beginning with knowing oneself and being authentic, connecting positively with other girls, being responsible for one's words and actions - especially on social media, and accepting perfectly imperfect instead of trying to look like the perfect images one sees. It will also include how to be brave, assertive, boundaried, and courageous enough to take risks and dream big.

Approved School Calendar Amendments for 2018/19 and 2019/20

On February 2nd, 2018, the Ministry of Education announced the reduction of instructional hours to the 2018-19 school year to facilitate implementation of the revised curriculum. SD43 has now approved an amendment to the calendar to meet the Ministry of Education mandate. **Friday, November 9th, 2018 has been approved as the additional non-instructional day to meet the mandate.**

On February 9th, 2018, the Office of the Premier announced the moving of BC Family day to the third week of February beginning next year. To maintain the alignment of the 2018/19 and 2019/20 calendars that have already been passed by the board, both Family Day and a school closure day for the 2018/19 and 2019/20 calendar year have been moved back one week. **Schools will now be closed on Friday Feb 15 for a 'Schools not in Session day', and for Monday Feb 18 for BC Family Day.**

Parenting Wisely Course



Parenting Wisely is a free course about managing the behaviour of elementary school children. Topics include waiting patiently until conversations or phone calls are over, morning and bedtime routines, cooperating with friends and siblings, behaving in public and schoolwork challenges. Two Parenting Wisely courses are being presented by Stan Swisher and Porter Street Elementary School.

One course starts **Tuesday April 17, 2018, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This course will run for 7 consecutive Tuesdays and ends on May 29, 2018. A second course starts **Wednesday April 18, 2018, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This course will run for 7 consecutive Wednesdays and ends on May 30, 2018.

Both courses will be held at **Porter Street Elementary School, 728 Porter St., Coquitlam**. You need to attend the first class to take either course. Please register with the school office, between **Tuesday April 3, 2018 and Friday April 13, 2018, at telephone # 604-936-4256**.
