#### Fire Pod – A visit from the Aboriginal Education Department and Kirk Gummow

Students in **Fire Pod** are working hard on an interdisciplinary project that parents will be able to see come to fruition in May at the Presentation of Learning event. In preparation for this, students have been writing essays and will move on to stories and poems in Term 3, all around our school-wide theme of *change*. This week, we had a visit from **Kirk Gummow** who is from the District Aboriginal Education department. He taught students about the importance of an oral culture and of telling meaningful stories. Students have been asked to consider features such as voice, the 4 senses, timing, and sound effects.

We are appreciative of the time well spent with Kirk who also shared these words with us: Storytelling in Indigenous context promotes oral language development, listening skills and comprehension as well as introduces learners to literary strategies of metaphor, prediction and foreshadowing. Above all, however, stories have the power to make our hearts, minds, bodies and spirits work together. And as Sto:lo Storyteller and scholar **Jo-Anne Archibald** wrote in her acclaimed book StoryWork, "Only when our hearts, minds, bodies and spirits work together do we truly have Indigenous Education."



#### **Aboriginal Education Button Blanket**

**Elder Dawn Brown** and **Monique DuTour**, Aboriginal Education youth worker, have been busy with our Aboriginal Education students working on creating and stitching together a ceremonial robe that we will unveil in a traditional ceremony within our new building later this spring. The 4 month long process marks the important stories and values that have been a strength of Moody Middle School over the years and that we will continue to embody once we have moved to our new location. We are fortunate to be nestled

within a rich and diverse community of people, animals, culture, stories, geography and vocations. This is truly evident in the care and respect put into our ceremonial robe by our students. Special thanks to Elder Dawn and Monique for helping to guide our students through this amazing and transformative journey that is our school.
