WHAT A GAS!

During our Science blocks, divisions 8 and 9 have been learning about the characteristics of plant and animal cells. Students compared the parts and functions of an animal cell to a larger thing (a school, a house, a stadium) and created a large scale drawing of it; they designed and constructed an edible plant cell and presented it orally in front of the class (then enjoyed their delicious creations). Most recently, our students have learned proper safety protocol in a science lab and have put it to use in their first lab of the year: Making Hydrogen Gas! Students each wore a lab coat and safety goggles, mixed water with aluminum foil and Sodium Hydroxide, which produced enough gas to fill up a small balloon. Then, at a safe distance, we held each balloon over an open flame to discover that hydrogen is flammable....and why hydrogen is no longer used for hot-air balloons or blimps! (Many thanks to Mr. Abello for his guidance with this lab!)

LIBRARY NEWS

Attention all readers! After a 3-year gap, **Battle of the Books** is back. In teams of 2, students will take part in a series of elimination battles here at Moody, answering questions about the books. Each participant is responsible for reading 2 of the books. The final battle takes place at the <u>Inlet Theatre at Port Moody City Hall</u> after spring break where each middle school sends 1 team of 2 students to compete for the trophy. Titles of the books will be revealed before Christmas break so stay tuned!

Battle of the Books is a joint venture between SD43 School Libraries and the <u>Port Moody Public</u> <u>Library</u>. The Port Moody Public Librarian secures the venue for the final battle, writes the final battle questions, helps judge and provides additional copies of the selected books into their collection.

COMPUTATIONAL THINKING MICRO BITS

Last week Mr. Abdulla attended the first of three learning sessions in SD43 to support computational thinking and coding through the use of Micro Bits. Last year we began schoolwide opportunities to support student learning in computational thinking in this area of the curriculum with Spheros. This year we plan to expand those coding opportunities and Mr. Abdulla is helping lead our staff in this area.

PRO-D UPDATE – WHAT DID OUR TEACHERS DO MONDAY?

December 4th was a school based Professional Development day for EMMSOTA staff. École Moody Middle School of the Arts teachers spent their morning assessing resources to be used with upcoming big ideas from the refreshed curriculum. Since we are working toward ensuring we only pack and bring current and actively used resources and furniture to the new building, this focus was particularly helpful.

During the afternoon the Team Leaders got a tour of the new school and examined all the flexible and beautiful features of our new state of the art building. Teachers also worked with their pod to develop more intentional leadership and integration of the core competencies to their classes and how to have students share their learning through various platforms, like Freshgrade.

ASK ME ABOUT

This is a new weekly feature to help promote conversations at home between parents/guardians and their child. Our EMMSOTA learners are becoming experts about their own learning needs, styles and accomplishments. In order for each student to make progress with this understanding, we need our students to talk about their learning with others each day. Here is this week's question to ask your child: **Where have you used your critical thinking competencies this week?**

Students who are dry and warm are more likely to be comfortable and in the green zone, ready to learn.

Winter Weather Ahead!

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m**. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

Extreme weather can also impact transit. Transit schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents seeking information on transit schedules need to consult the Translink website: <u>http://www.translink.ca/</u>
