CURRICULUM INSTRUCTION DAY FOR TEACHERS

November 24th was a curriculum implementation day for all teachers in SD43. École Moody Middle School of the Arts teachers spent the morning engaged in dialogue about how we are incorporating the revised curriculum into our lessons with students. Special focus was spent on computational thinking and the core competencies. Just like our students are accustomed to, we spent time in various classrooms learning from each other. We shared how students are showing their learning in the areas of communication, thinking, and personal and social responsibility. The afternoon was spent inquiring into our curricular competencies as reflected on our new report card templates. Finally, we reviewed Office 365 as a platform for the sharing of information across the various devices that we have at school and in our homes. Students have already begun using this platform to complete work at home that has been saved at school and this is changing the way we work together and process our learning! Place-based learning and experiential learning were at the heart of our day and we look forward to incorporating our learning into our work with students effective immediately! Mrs. Stibbs, M. Abello, Mr. Kolkea, and Ms Jung, were all instrumental in planning and leading sessions for our colleagues. The day wasn't long enough!

LIBRARY NEWS

Attention all readers! After a 3-year gap, **Battle of the Books** is back. This is a competition to see how well you know your books. 4 books have been selected by the Teacher Librarians from 8 participating middle schools. In teams of 2, students will take part in a series of elimination battles here at Moody, answering questions about the books. Each participant is responsible for reading 2 of the books. The final battle takes place at the <u>Inlet Theatre at Port Moody City Hall</u> after spring break where each middle school sends 1 team of 2 students to compete for the trophy. Titles of the books will be revealed before Christmas break so stay tuned!

Battle of the Books is a joint venture between SD43 School Libraries and the <u>Port Moody Public Library</u>. The Port Moody Public Librarian secures the venue for the final battle, writes the final battle questions, helps judge and provides additional copies of the selected books into their collection.

For any students interested in participating, there will be more details in the coming weeks. Listen for them on the morning announcements, or see Ms. Leonard in the library if you have any questions.

This is a new weekly feature to help promote conversations at home between parents/guardians and their child. Winter Weather Ahead!

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m**. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

Extreme weather can also impact transit. Transit schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents seeking information on transit schedules need to consult the Translink website: http://www.translink.ca/
