The students and staff involved have been preparing for weeks leading up to our shows on May 28th, 29th and 30th. It is exciting to see the cast develop and grow over the past few weeks. Ms. Magnusson and Ms. Ono have been working them hAAAAAAAAARRRRRD! (sorry couldn't resist). We are all looking forward to the big performances not to far aft and away now. (again couldn't resist)

June is right around the corner and that will take us to more exciting events for both students and our greater learning community. Mrs. Reichert and her bands and choir will be performing on June 13th, another showcase of the Arts at EMMSOTA. June 18th we celebrate learning school wide as we showcase some of the year long activities and projects related to **Mythology and how it has shaped our culture**. A couple quick reminders for our community as we head into June and begin the wind up before the wind down of year end. We encourage regular conversations about healthy choices with your children. Students are faced with many decisions as they enter into adolescence and attempt to define who they are. Parents and Guardians need to stay present and aware both in person and in your children's online world. Three great conversation starters are:

- 1) "What are you "chatting" about in your several different **social media sites**?" Yes, our children usually run for the hills when we approach them with anything related to their social media profile. It is our responsibility as parents and guardians, to ensure our children are being respectful digital citizens. Expecting our children to navigate the world of social media without guidance is not ok. Adults need to be aware, even if we are not all comfortable with social media ourselves. Ask and stay interested. Set boundaries on amounts of time online and how they interact with others. It is a whole other level of parenting and **absolutely necessary**.
- 2) "**Vaping**" and "**E-cigarettes**" is a very dangerous new trend that is hitting home with students younger and younger. We are being negligent if we think it is a passing trend and that it really is "no big deal". It is time to understand and take a stand as many in schools and communities did around smoking 20 plus years ago. Our youth are making decisions that are trendy, convenient and cool...without really having the knowledge to make the healthy choice. We have provided resources that highlight the dangers of vaping for our youth in several past newsletters. The links are attached again below. Learn what you can do to shift the trend and truly understand the health risks related to youth and vaping.
- 3) As the weather gets warmer we begin having more **conversations about dress expectations** in schools. Middle and Secondary Schools have been discussing with staff, students and parents our dress codes. While we want to honour freedom and expression in what students wear, it is important that parents also have conversations with their children about what NOT to wear to school. Dress for success! Less skin is more! Dress for business not the beach! These are all things we remind our students so we are consistent across all genders, shapes and sizes. Cover up undergarments, midriiffs, bottoms. Stay away from symbols and slogans that are potentially offensive. Keep your hats and hoodies off so we can see your beautiful faces. All conversations we have with students on an ongoing basis. It is a great support for us if you are having the same conversations at home as well. Thank you for that in advance!

It continues to be a whirlwind of energy and enthusiasm here at EMMSOTA, a truly great place to be!
