Pick Up and Drop Off: Keeping our Students Safe To and From School

We are still seeing some very unusual and to be honest, incredibly unsafe driving patterns during drop off and pick up at the school. We understand that construction and road closures have made getting to and from school very difficult and we appreciate your patience. It is imperative that parents and guardians please take note of traffic patterns and perhaps give yourselves a bit more time to get to school. Walk if you can and be good to the environment. In the event that you drive your child to school, please **SLOW DOWN**, keep traffic flowing, **NO U-TURNS** on Buller or Henry, and pull right over on the side of the road where you can. We ask that you also have conversations with your children about crossing the road in appropriate places and staying to the side of the road when coming to and form school. We have already witnessed too many close calls and the constructions interruptions will continue for a few more months. PLEASE keep our students safe. Thank you.



We would like to emphasize that traffic should follow Williams to Henry, then Buller. If stopping on Buller, students *must* be picked up and dropped off on the EAST side of Buller.

SchoolCashOnline, Student Activity Fees and Forms

ONLINE FORMS: Student Activity fees and Permission forms are now due. Please complete your online permission forms and make the activity fee payment by the end of this week if possible. It is very important that these forms are completed - if you are unable to receive online forms, please contact the office or your student's teacher to arrange for paper copies.

PAPER FORMS: Last week, our PAPER Student Verification form and Emergency Preparation forms were sent home. These forms are very important for us to update our Student Records system, and to use in case of Emergency situations. Please ensure these forms are returned to your student's homeroom teacher by Monday September 24, if they haven't been turned in yet.

Communication

Announcements that are made each morning at the school are posted on our website daily to facilitate shared communication between the classrooms and our school community. Parents with messages for their children are asked to contact the office. Notifications of these messages will be passed on to the student during nut break, lunch time or at the end of the day. As we are protective of the learning environment of all our students, we cannot relay messages to students during class time concerning social arrangements.

Student Services

The Friends of Simon tutoring program will start at the beginning of October. "Friends of Simon is an award-winning Simon Fraser University Faculty of Education initiative, committed to building a brighter future for school-aged children and teenagers through literacy, tutoring, and mentoring in local communities" (Friends of Simon website).

The tutoring sessions will take place every Friday, from 3:00 to 5:00pm and are free of charge. To be part of this program and take advantage of the educational support provided by the Friends of Simon, the students need to maintain regular attendance and demonstrate sociallyresponsible behaviors. They are also responsible for bringing their homework to class (Language Arts, English, Social Studies, Math, Science). The referrals to the program will be made by the classroom teachers, in consultation with the Student Services staff.

Outside Play Day!

Every day at Moody Middle School is an outside play day unless it is raining really hard. Sign up for equipment at the office and enjoy a break getting active! Students are asked to please dress appropriately for the weather. The covered walkway structure is a beautiful conversation piece however, it does send water into the rock pond that students have realized, leads to being cold and wet which is not conducive to optimal learning.

DRILLS! DRILLS! DRILLS!

Did you know that students and staff regularly practice emergency drills such as fire drills, earthquake drills, lockdown drills and emergency release drills? This year, being in a new building, it is particularly important for teachers, staff and students to work together throughout the school year to review safety procedures especially for students and staff new to the school or visiting us at school. When we practice being prepared, we are able to respond more safely and calmly in the event of an emergency. While fire drills and earthquake drills have been practiced for many years, a Shelter-In-Place drill is still quite new and the Hold and Secure and Lockdown drills are less common.

A **Shelter-In-Place** drill is used when personal safety is considered to be in danger if anyone leaves the school. It is usually associated with an environmental hazard where hazardous materials are released into the atmosphere. For example, a chemical spill or gas leak in the immediate vicinity of the school. Shelter in place might also be used in the case of a wild animal in the vicinity of the school. When a Shelter in Place order is called, students will continue normal activities in the school as well as close exterior doors and windows.

A **Hold and Secure** drill is most commonly used when an incident is occurring outside the school building, on or off school property, and there is no immediate or active threat (such as a bear on the property). This is a procedure which allows the school to continue with the normal school day inside the school with very limited room-to-room transit within.

Lockdown drills are a more recent practice that are similar to an earthquake or fire drill. These drills require that students and staff stay calm and move away from view so that to an intruder, such as an animal or uninvited guest, the school looks uninhabited. Emergency release drills are practiced with ample notice to our parents as we aim to successfully release all students based on the contact and release information provided from home.

As some students may be new to these procedures, it is an ideal time to discuss the importance of practicing safety procedures both at home and at school. For up to date information, parents are asked to check the school website and to consider refraining from calling your child on his or her personal phone. Ms. Jung will be working with staff at school to help students be successful practicing these drills in a safe environment. Please remember to update your contact information with the school as changes are made.
