Parking and Drop Off Updates (please read)

First week back after break has been somewhat chaotic out front of the school as they continue with the roadwork, curbing and sidewalks. We thank parents for their care and caution when coming to and from the school. Here are just a few updates and reminders to help us continue to keep everyone safe as our parking lot gets nearer to completion.

- ** They are likely pouring the sidewalk at some point Tuesday or Wednesday next week and we will then look at our alternate plan for dismissal out the back of the school. We will give you some notice when that will happen with an email and statement on our website.
- **Plan to arrive early or pick up a bit later so you avoid the main bulk of traffic in front of the school.
- ** Consider parking further away on William, St John's or James Street to minimize congestion at peak times. Students are very capable of walking a few hundred metres to school.
- ** NO U-TURNS PLEASE, anywhere on Buller, William or Henry Streets. We are still seeing some cars pull U-Turns for convenience on Buller Street near the school. THIS IS NOT SAFE!
- ** Please pull up and over as far right as you can when dropping off or picking up on the EAST side of Buller ONLY!
- ** always drive slowly and carefully around the school. This is most important!
