

Communicating Student Learning:

Student-Parent-Teacher Three Way Conferences as a means of **Communicating Student Learning** are coming on November 27th-29th. We will have early dismissals for students on the 28th and 29th to allow teachers the time to facilitate conferencing with all students and families beginning at 1:30pm. These conferences are part of an authentic and ongoing assessment process. Parent involvement in student learning is one of the key factors in determining student success and we would really like to see all families participate in this very valuable process. Moody's Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup



Last Friday November 2 our school participated in the Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup. The Shoreline Cleanup is recognized as one of the largest conservation initiatives in Canada. The program's mission is to inspire us to keep all shorelines free of litter, and it provides the opportunity for us to take action in our own communities, wherever water meets land, one bit of trash at a time.

Our youth worker Christine and grade 8 fire pod students Hailey, Grace, Hannah and Rebecca organized the cleanup of Dallas Creek, which is just

south of our school. Divisions 7, 11, and their teachers Mr. Abdulla, Ms. Reichert, did a spectacular job taking away unwanted trash from the creek and surrounding areas. We took 35kg of trash out of the environment! Top 5 items found were pieces of foam and plastic less than 2.5cm, cigarette butts, food wrappers and plastic bottles, which are the top 5 found in all the cleanups across Canada!
