Happy New Year to our entire EMMSOTA Community.

We hope that everyone enjoyed their winter break and spent lots of time with family and friends relaxing, laughing and enjoying the festive season. It was so nice to welcome your children back to school in a new decade. The vibe around the school the first few days back was very positive, and it was clear all our students and staff were rested and ready to take on 2020.

There is no such thing as a slow start back for middle schools. Band and Choir is up and running, our sports teams are practicing, and auditions have begun for our Spring Musical, Willy Wonka. Daily Art is back in action and Pods are preparing to have their egg drop competitions leading up to the finals happening at our January 31, Spirit Gathering. Our egg drop competition is just one of the many connections we made to our school wide read, *The Science of Breakable Things*, by Tae Keller. The key themes of the book referenced mental health and well being, middle school age friendships and social dynamics, and the scientific method centred around an egg drop competition. Many teams have used this school wide read to connect different parts of the curriculum and create art that captures themes throughout the story. We are looking forward to the 31st Gathering and our art installation unveiling sometime later in February. These really are some great examples of how our learning community comes together around our common themes and visions.

Our Grade 8s are starting to prepare for Grade 9 articulation and course selection as we host several different secondary school counsellors in our building over the next couple of weeks before we send our Grade 8s on their Secondary Walkabout January 24th in the afternoon. This is also the time of year when programs of choice applications are open, and we begin our cross-catchment process. Please be sure to stay on top of deadlines and applications if you are planning on applying for any special program at a secondary school or if your younger children coming into middle school are looking at on of our District’s middle level programs of choice. 

Winter Weather Ahead!

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m.** so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.


While the District tries to make the best decision with the information available, the weather does change quickly. Therefore, when schools remain open, decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

Extreme weather can also impact transit. Transit schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents seeking information on transit schedules need to consult the Translink website: <http://www.translink.ca/>

Face to Face Connections:




