Student Learning Survey 2019/2020

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents, teachers and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in **2020** the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grade 7, their parents, and all school staff. We encourage parents to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at <u>http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey</u>. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and the *Direct access* section of the log in page by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

Computers will be made available to parents who wish to complete the survey but need a device. Please contact Ms. Jung at <u>kjung@sd43.bc.ca</u> to arrange this.

For parents who do not wish to use school computers, local public library computers may be another option. The e-survey site will be open early in the new year until mid-April.

(circumference is the distance around the edge of the circle and the diameter is the distance from one side of the circle to the other, making sure to pass through the middle of the circle!) Science World

Great fun was had by all at our recent Science World field trip Our Moody community had a wonderful opportunity to visit Science World in Vancouver. Using practical and systematic observations, students were able to investigate the physical and natural world through experience and live shows on the main stage. Highlights of the trip included the LEGO gallery, which showcased scale models of the world's landmarks and tallest buildings. The Eureka! Area which allowed our scientists to learn and apply principles of physics was also a hit. The Discovery Lab and the Optical Illusions areas challenged many of our students



to think creatively to solve different sorts of puzzles and illusions. We would like to thank all of the many parent volunteers who were able to help with this successful trip. Hand Washing Prevents the Spread of Germs

Wash your hands for 20 seconds (minimum) to fully clean your hands to limit the transfer of bacteria, viruses and germs. 




SKI & SNOWBOARD CLUB


