As we continue to discuss truth and reconciliation in our country, we cannot avoid some very difficulty conversations. I want to thank Mme Grayston and Mme Wainwright for bringing Elder Sam George in to speak with us as part of our Orange Shirt day events. I also want to acknowledge our Aboriginal Student Leaders who were so very welcoming to Sam and his guest. It was a memorable afternoon for everyone who was involved.

Today we ended our Terry Fox Campaign with an eventful afternoon involving the big reveal of our fundraising totals, and as has become some sort of tradition; pies...more specifically some pies in the faces of some very good sports who put themselves out there for our fundraising efforts. Congratulations to our entire school for reaching our goal of \$7000. 00. Thanks to Ms. Paquette for spearheading our Terry Fox campaign this year and all the students who helped with our assemblies over the past few weeks.

I would like to acknowledge our PAC for getting our year off and running. Our first big fundraiser is just around the corner and we would love to see you all there. Our PAC events are not just about raising money, they are about building a strong community of families that support learning for all students. He shared the story of his experience as a Residential School survivor. His presentation included his highs and lows, as well as the experience, strength and hope that brought him to where he is today.



Traffic Safety update

As the days get colder and the darkness looms longer, our bodies often feel more sluggish. Please allow for extra time to get to school to help ensure student safety. Our school day begins for many of our students at 7:40 am for band and choir, not just at 8:40 am when all students are expected to be seated in class, ready to learn! Also, please take care to adhere to the signage posting speed limits of 30km/hr during school hours, and 10 km/hr in our parking lot. The street signals show us what to do but we still need to be critically aware of our surroundings at all times. Students are asked to be courteous to drivers of motor vehicles at all times!

Here are a few popular slogans from Ms Jung relating to cell phones: "Text then walk!" "Talk then walk!" Thank you for helping to keep our students and staff safe throughout the day whether staff are on supervision duty or not. If we can routinely practice pulling well ahead in the drop-off and pick-up lane in the parking lot, the traffic promises to flow more fluidly. Safe students are happy staff which makes for happy students!

If you still have the Student Verification form and Emergency Release form at home, *please return these to School ASAP*. These forms are mandatory for each school year, as we use the information to ensure we have accurate and complete information for all student and parent contacts, as well as emergency release procedures.

In addition to the forms above, each year we also ask parents to complete and pay (using SchoolCashOnline) the **District Policies Forms & School Activity Fee**

Our School District continues its full transition to ONLINE form completion, fee payments, permission forms and newsletters. We encourage all families to ensure they are signed up for SchoolCashOnline, as we will be sending home on-line notices regarding field trips, permission forms, yearbook purchases and more using this method.
