Our first few weeks into the new decade and the pace of school and learning is really picking up. Life at École Moody Middle School of the Arts is in full swing both in and out of the classrooms. Our Moody Matters news updates usually capture some of the highlights going on in the school. Here are just a few of mine, noticeable in the first few weeks back from break.

- ** Learning is everywhere...as I walk through the halls at any given time of day, I see students in classrooms and spilling out into the halls collaborating, planning, cooperating, learning, in all nooks and crannies of the school. Our learning spaces take on new looks everyday and it speaks to our belief in flexible learning spaces and individual student engagement.
- ** Our move to BYOD is now school--wide as our final two Pods came on board upon our return from break. Teachers and students are navigating the enhanced learning opportunities that technology offers while being mindful of screen time and digital responsibility. Lessons and conversations continue to remind students how we can be better digital citizens and ensure that technology does not consume us.
- ** Health and Wellness continues to be our school wide focus as we plan for our Health and Wellness Fair in May. Daily Art provides a mindful outlet that sets us up for the day while accessing our creative side and establishing healthy brain activity first thing in the morning.
- ** The second round of BRICK has begun, and students are building relationships, inquiry, creativity and knowledge across several different activities such as Minecraft, Knitting and Weaving, The Art of Calm and Lego Building to name just a few. Our BRICK establishes new relationships with other students and adults across the school outside of the regular classroom. It is a strong part of what we do differently at the middle level.
- ** It is a very Musical time of Year...yes, our school musical is underway as students have chosen this as their BRICK choice and rehearsals and auditions are ongoing as we prepare for Willy Wonka in April. Sixty-four students are already involved, and the excitement will continue to build right up to our performance in Late April.

We had the pleasure of hosting our Superintendent, Patricia Gartland and Assistant Superintendent Reno Ciolfi for a quick walkaround and tour of all that is ÉMMSOTA. They were very impressed with the energy and enthusiasm apparent in the many different activities going on around the school. It was nice to be able to brag about all the great things going on around here, a testament to our staff, students and extended learning community!

February is upon us soon and we are looking forward to our focus on kindness and caring. Stay tuned for events and ideas coming up around the school.

Winter Weather Ahead!

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m**. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

While the District tries to make the best decision with the information available, the weather does change quickly. Therefore, when schools remain open, decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

Extreme weather can also impact transit. Transit schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents seeking information on transit schedules need to consult the TransLink website: http://www.translink.ca/


