We are looking forward to getting to know our new staff members and reacquainting with our other colleagues as the year progresses. Our staff and students will continue our focus on health and wellbeing, numeracy and arts integration as part of our yearly goals and action plans for learning. Our professional growth opportunities line up with these goals and our collaboration is rich and rewarding as we learn together.

Every Year ÉMMSOTA comes up with a school wide theme to connect our learning to the larger school and outside community. These themes often drive what we produce for our yearly art installation. Last Spring staff came up with the theme of "Innovation and the Environment", very topical considering where our world is at currently. As we met for the first few days of September, before students officially arrived, I challenged staff with a message I heard years ago from an administrator colleague from inner city LA; "See the invisible and do the impossible." Our school wide theme speaks to this as we are being asked to do things differently in education and to find new ways to operate during a global pandemic. We are faced with the reality of changes to our environment; physically, politically, and socially that will impact generations to come. It is through this lens we will create, collaborate, and generate ideas and passions for a world needing change. We are excited to get things rolling!

This year, we continue for a second year with our Daily Art initiative to inspire creativity while bringing out the artist within at the beginning of our learning day. We have provided every student with some basic daily art supplies; a sketchbook, charcoal pencil, 10 pack of watercolour pencil crayons, paint brush and white eraser, to support our school-wide goal to integrate the Arts into all that we do. Explorations teachers have begun their year in classrooms laying the foundation for creativity within our school wide theme of "Innovation and the Environment". Attendance, (including lates & early dismissals)

Parents/guardians are asked to report all absences, including daily, ongoing absences, lates or early dismissals, using our online Absence Report form – click here: <u>Absence Report</u> (Available under QUICKLINKS on our website)

Our secretary "call back" is in place to help ensure the safety of our children and we call all contact numbers in priority sequence if a child is not accounted for. Please assist us by ensuring that you have called in to report your child's absence.

Lates:

Please assist your child in arriving to school on time. Schedules and routines are extremely important to a student's development and academic achievement as key concepts and lessons begin promptly at our scheduled bell time. Students arriving late should come through the main front entrance, sanitize and sign-in at the LATES desk. Students will then be escorted to their classroom or given instructions from the office.

Early Dismissals:

Whenever possible, please make appointments for your child outside of school hours. If you do need to pick up your child early, we ask that you advise your child, your child's teacher and the office in advance so that the student is ready to leave without interrupting their classmates. Please notify the school regarding the time of departure and pick-up or student transportation plans (walking/bus/etc.).

All students must sign out in person at the office before leaving school property. Students must have permission to leave before they will be allowed to sign out.

If you are picking up your student, please call the office when you arrive. We will send the student out to you in the parking lot.

Parking, Transportation and Student Safety

Please plan to *drop-off* and *pick-up* your student off site as much as possible to reduce the traffic flow. Our parking lot does allow for a few cars at a time to drop off and pick up students, and if you choose to use the drop-off zone, we ask that you support us in making this work in a safe and respectful way. The drop off and pick up spaces are in our staff parking lot along the south side adjacent to the school. Please keep to a safe speed of 10km/hr and less in our lot and through the drop off zone. Be mindful that this is a **staff only parking lot** and spaces are limited. **The flow of traffic is one way in, all the way around the lot and out the same way stopping at the stop sign before entering the intersection.** Please drive cautiously in our school zone of 30 km/hr and less, thinking about student safety first. We appreciate the number of parents who have chosen to access our nearby streets (e.g. James, Henry, St. George) to drop off and pick up your child. No U-Turns, please.

This is an ideal time to remind your children about traffic safety and being mindful of crosswalks and sidewalk use. Student safety is of utmost importance to all of us, so please consider doing your best to support our plan. We all thank you.

NEW Traffic Calming Measures

This week, we were notified that **beginning September 28**, the City of Port Moody is introducing **traffic calming measures on St. George Street** to improve pedestrian, cyclist, and driver safety in our neighbourhood. This may impact how you approach the school. Please note that some of the changes you will see include barricades so that there is:

- -No eastbound access to St. George Street from Albert Street, Kyle Street, and Hugh Street
- -No westbound access to St. George Street from Elgin Street, Grant Street, and Buller Street
- -All vehicles will still be able to exit St. George Street at all intersections.
- -Restrictions will not apply to pedestrians or cyclists.

Please plan your trip accordingly as we become accustomed to these new traffic calming measures which the City of Port Moody will be reviewing through the end of summer 2021.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

Students are asked to *Bring Your Own Device* on a daily basis. Technology is an incredible tool that supports learning and we want to ensure students have easy access to it on a regular and timely basis. This does not mean their entire days will be in front of a screen. We will continue to have clear expectations for technology use that include "Tech Free Breaks" at Nutrition Break and Lunch, and cell phones / personal devices stored away when not in use supporting learning in the classroom.

Class Placement

Every year we spend an incredible amount of time building classes and considering many factors to create the best possible learning environments for all our students. It is not a perfect science and we are not always able to place students with their friends every year. While we like to keep students in the same Pod for at least a couple of years, our class size and composition numbers often dictate the need to move some students around. This process is done collaboratively with teachers and other staff. We do what we can to make appropriate class placements in all situations. We ask that students and parents support our decisions and have positive conversations about change and the opportunity to make new friends in a variety of school community settings. Our Learning Groups are now in place and we will be moving

forward with our current class composition ensuring student and staff safety first and foremost. Thank you.

Supplies

School supplies purchased from Creative Children have arrived at École Moody Middle and were distributed directly to students this week. Please use the weekend to label all supplies before they return to school. Please have your student ask their teacher what to bring and when, as lockers are not available at this time. Lunches

Please send your child with a litter-less snack, lunch and refillable water bottle each day. We do not have microwaves or hot water (kettles) available for student use. We ask that you work with us to ensure student safety by sending students to school with food at the start of the day rather than dropping it off at the office during the day. We are trying to limit drop-offs as this adds another complication to contact tracing if and when needed. Any drop off of lunch for students requires parents to call the office before entering the building, follow safety protocols, by sanitizing hands and signing in upon entry. It is imperative all families follow these safety protocols. Please ensure your child has all their belongings for the day when they leave in the morning.

Communication

Announcements that are made each morning at the school are posted on our website daily to facilitate shared communication between the classrooms and our school community.

Parents with messages for their children are asked to contact the office. Notifications of these messages will be passed on to the student during nut break, lunch time or at the end of the day. As we are protective of the learning environment of all our students, we cannot relay messages to students during class time concerning social arrangements. We also ask parents to respect our technology expectations and *not to text or contact your child directly* by cell phone during the school day. Messages sent through the office are always the best way to go. Thank you.
