This year our Terry Fox Run was considerably different, as it was in all schools and communities across our country. That did not deter from honouring Terry's incredible spirit, and as a school we all met online for a virtual Terry Fox Assembly last Thursday. Each class brought forward a goal to represent Terry's tenacious spirit and were raising both funds and awareness over the past few days. The energy online was a testament to Terry's dream and while we may not have been able to raise as many funds this year for obvious reasons, the students keep Terry's dream alive in their hearts and minds!

We are into our second month of the school year and teachers are starting to raise the expectation level both in our classrooms and around the school. We continue to remind students what it means to be a R-E-S-P-E-C-Tful Moody Middle student. We appreciate all the support from home, discussing our school wider behavior expectations and how every day we need to think about how we take care of ourselves, others and our environment. We ask that

parents and families review our code of conduct in the student agenda books and online to ensure we are all on the same page in areas such as dress expectations, technology usage around the school and following our daily health and safety guidelines. Thank you.

This week we are inviting our parent/guardian community to our vEMMSOTA Virtual Open House Meet the Teacher event. Our secretary "call back" is in place to help ensure the safety of your children and we call all contact numbers in priority sequence if a child is not accounted for. *Please assist us by ensuring that you have called in to report your child's absence*.

#### Lates:

Please help your child arrive to school on time! Schedules and routines are extremely important to a student's development and academic achievement as key concepts and lessons begin promptly at our scheduled bell time. Students arriving late should come through the main front entrance, sanitize and sign-in at the LATES desk. Students will then be escorted to their classroom or given instructions from the office.

#### **Early Dismissals:**

Whenever possible, please make appointments for your child outside of school hours. If you do need to pick up your child early, we ask that you advise your child, your child's teacher and the office in advance so that the student is ready to leave without interrupting their classmates. Please notify the school regarding the time of departure and pick-up or student transportation plans (walking/bus/etc.). All students must sign out in person at the office before leaving school property. Students must have permission to leave before they will be allowed to sign out.

If you are picking up your student, please call the office when you arrive. We will send the student out to you in the parking lot.

## **Parking, Transportation and Student Safety**

The City of Port Moody and Port Moody Police will soon be conducting traffic studies to improve the flow of traffic around our neighbourhood, and to ensure drivers are adhering to prescribed traffic regulations. The police will be doing traffic checks and issuing traffic violations. We remind drivers to follow traffic regulations, including school speed zones of 30 km/hr or less, NO Uturns in intersections or on our surrounding roads.

Please plan to *drop-off* and *pick-up* your student off site (James, Henry, St. George streets) as much as possible to reduce the traffic flow. Our parking lot does allow for a few cars at a time to drop off and pick up students. The drop off and pick up spaces are in our **staff only** parking lot along the south side adjacent to the school. Please keep to a safe speed of 10km/hr inside the



parking lot. The flow of traffic is one way in, all the way around the lot to exit, stopping at the stop sign before entering the intersection.



This is an ideal time to remind your children about traffic safety and being mindful at crosswalks and sidewalk use, especially with the change in light at this time of year! Student safety is of utmost importance to all of us, so please consider doing your best to support our plan. We all thank you.

#### **NEW Traffic Calming Measures**

This week, we were notified that **beginning September 28**, the City of Port Moody is introducing **traffic calming measures on St. George Street** to improve pedestrian, cyclist, and driver safety in our neighbourhood. This may impact how you approach the school. Please note this will include barricades. so that there is:

- -No eastbound access to St. George Street from Albert Street, Kyle Street, and Hugh Street
- -No westbound access to St. George Street from Elgin Street, Grant Street, and Buller Street

All vehicles will still be able to exit St. George Street at all intersections.

Restrictions will not apply to pedestrians or cyclists.

Please plan your trip accordingly as we become accustomed to these new traffic calming measures which the City of Port Moody will be reviewing through the end of summer 2021.

#### **Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)**

Students are asked to *Bring Your Own Device* on a daily basis. Technology is an incredible tool that supports learning and we want to ensure students have easy access to their technology on a regular and timely basis. This does not mean their entire days will be in front of a screen. We will continue to have clear expectations for technology use that include "Tech Free Breaks" at Nutrition Break and Lunch, and cell phones / personal devices stored away when not in use supporting learning in the classroom.

#### Lunches

Please send your child with a litter-less snack, lunch and refillable water bottle each day. We do not have microwaves or hot water (kettles) available for student use. We ask that you work with us to ensure student safety by sending students to school with food at the start of the day rather than dropping it off at the office during the day. We are trying to limit drop-offs as this adds another complication to contact tracing if and when needed. Any drop off of lunch for students requires parents to call the office before entering the building, follow safety protocols, by sanitizing hands and signing in upon entry. It is imperative all families follow these safety protocols. Please ensure your child has all their belongings for the day when they leave in the morning.

#### Communication

Announcements that are made each morning at the school are posted on our website daily to facilitate shared communication between the classrooms and our school community.

Parents with messages for their children are asked to contact the office. Notifications of these messages will be passed on to the student during nut break, lunch time or at the end of the day. As we are protective of the learning environment of all our students, we cannot relay messages to students during class time concerning social arrangements. We also ask parents to respect our technology expectations and *not to text or contact your child directly* by cell phone during the school day. Messages sent through the office are always the best way to go. Thank you.
