## Gauss Mathematics Contest

This year, there were 80 contestants who wrote the Grade 7 Gauss Contest or Grade 8 Gauss Contest put on by the Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing (cemc.uwaterloo.ca), University of Waterloo. The students who wrote answered 25 multiple choice questions in three parts using strategy to aim for a personal high score! Unanswered questions garnered 2 points up to a total of 20 points so students needed to weigh the possibility of getting the question right with the guarantee of receiving 2 points per question! What would you do?! Each part was progressively more difficult with only 60 minutes to write! Congratulations to all students who accepted a math challenge and had fun, too!

## WIND POD

Health and Wellness with Wind Pod
Over the last month, Wind Pod students participated in a variety of learning opportunities to support health, wellbeing, and personal growth. We began with a field trip to Noons Creek Fish Hatchery to explore and learn about our local community which included releasing salmon, visiting the heron nesting site, and learning about Indigenous House Posts. Next, we invited a certified Yoga instructor to share her passion and expertise with us. This was followed by a visit to one of our local community gardens located next to the Port Moody Police Station. Next, we invited a motivational speaker, Randy Celebrini (physiotherapist, artist, and EMMSOTA parent) as a lead in to our first ever mini-Health and Wellness Conference. Our field trip to Rocky Point Park included activities such as rugby, baseball, football, cross fit, yoga, drumming, drama games, shoreline clean-up, arts, and crafts led by members of the local community and pod teachers. ## PLANETARIUM FIELD TRIP -Monday May 30

What a great day! On Monday, the students of Water Pod went to the HR MacMillan Space Center for a field trip. Each class did three activities. They explored the Cosmic Courtyard Exhibit which allowed the students to get a deeper understanding of some of Astronomy's most fascinating facts and discoveries. They also learned about light pollution, climate change, deep space, and the potential for life on other planets. The students then sat back and enjoyed learning about Space in the Planetarium Star Theatre.
