The list is posted outside the office and outside Ms. Turje's room for any students who haven't yet checked if they were selected. We're looking forward to five evenings of fun with the 50 students selected! Please refer to the first page of the information package for more information, as well as looking for an email from Ms. Turje soon with some of the same details. If your child was selected but will not be able to participate after all, please let Ms. Turje know ASAP (DTurje@sd43.bc.ca) so your child's space can be offered to another student.

Parents of selected students will need to complete the school permission form and payment in School Cash Online by November 23rd (notification for that should have gone out earlier this week), and the Mt Seymour lesson/rental registration by December 1st (use the link in the School Cash Online info). If those deadlines are not met, students will be removed from the Ski and Snowboard Club list and their space will be given to a student from the waiting list. After December 6th, refunds will not be possible for students who withdraw from the club (except for medical reasons with a doctor's note).

The waiting list has also been organized through a draw. If spaces become available, Ms Turje will contact parents by email (and try to connect with students at school) to offer up the open spot to the next student on the waiting list. As we get closer to December, the turnaround time for waitlist acceptance will become quite short so please respond promptly!

STREAM OF DREAMS

WINTER WEATHER AHEAD

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified. The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m.** so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

While the District tries to make the best decision with the information available, the weather does change quickly. Therefore, when schools remain open, decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family.

Extreme weather can also impact transit. Transit schedules may face significant changes or cancellations due to the weather conditions. Parents seeking information on transit schedules need to consult the Translink website: http://www.translink.ca/

STUDENT ABSENCES / LATES / EARLY DISMISSALS

If your student is going to be absent, please complete the 'Absence/Late/Early Dismissal' online form available on Moody Middle's website home page under 'Quick Links' or call the office at 604-461-7384. If submitting an online form for an early dismissal, please remember to include the time that the student will be leaving. Home - École Moody Middle School of the Arts (sd43.bc.ca)

When accessing our school website from a laptop or desktop computer, the link to the absence/late/early dismissal report can be found on the right side of the page under "Quick Links".

When accessing our school website from a smart phone, scroll all the way down to the bottom of the home page to find the "Quick Links" section.

Please remind your students that when they are feeling ill or want to go home, they should go to the office to have staff call home for parent permission to leave. Students should not be calling or texting parents directly as the office staff must speak with a parent or caregiver.

BYOD - BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE

Technology, along with 21st Century skills, plays an important role in the lives of students today. Our school is committed to improve student learning in the use of computer technology through its integration in all subject areas. Our teachers encourage their students to use technology tools available in our school and, particularly, to use them to present ideas, enhance creativity, organize thoughts and communicate effectively in a variety of ways. Students who are attending École Moody Middle School of the Arts are invited to send a device to school each day to be used in learning activities. Our BYOD Guide refers to the practice of "Bring Your Own Device," which is technology that is parent-owned but used by students at school for learning.

PHONES AT SCHOOL

Cell phones are important tools of communication. They are not, however, necessary for the day-to-day happenings at school. To help minimize distractions during learning and school time, EMMSOTA school policy asks students to leave their phones safely tucked in their lockers during school hours. This includes the morning nutrition break and lunch.

LOCKERS

Students have been assigned their lockers. Please remind your student to ensure they close and lock their locker each time they use it, and that they only use the lock provided by the school. There is a \$5 replacement fee for students that lose their locks so please ensure students are LOCKING their lock on their locker every time they use it.

The Parent Council Site is the EMMSOTA PAC's Communication platform. This is the parent hub for information regarding fundraising, school updates, hot lunch ordering and more. You will also find information for our PAC meetings like agendas and meeting minutes. It's a one-stop shop for all things PAC. On-line Registration is currently open and hot lunch ordering has begun for the school year.

Registering is easy - here's how:

- 1. Go to emmsota.parentcouncil.net
- 2. Click the "**REGISTER**" menu at the top right-hand corner to sign up. Our school code is **EMMSOTA1** (needs to be in ALL CAPS).
- 3. Enter your name, email address and phone, then a user id that you will use for access to the parent council site. Enter a password and then enter it again to verify that it is correct.
- 4. Once registered, you will be logged into the website.
- 5. Please add your students by clicking on the "STUDENTS" button below or the "PROFILE" menu tab to proceed. Once your child(ren) has been added to the system, you will be able to place lunch orders immediately by clicking the "Order" button below each child's name.

Not participating in hot lunch? We encourage you to register even if your child does not participate so that you are able to receive emails and reminders from the PAC, as well as receive information on any events happening at EMMSOTA.

Planning for the Future - November 16th

This presentation will include a panel of guest speakers representing school district 43 programs, inclusive post-secondary institutes, employment supports, government agencies, and community supports. Entering adulthood is an important milestone, therefore taking action early will help create a smooth and successful transition plan for the future.

Transition into Kindergarten – January 11th

The Learning Services Zone Coordinators and other school personnel from School District # 43 invite parents and caregivers of children with developmental delays, disabilities, and diverse learning needs to an information session to discuss what to expect when your child enters kindergarten. We will also discuss how you can be involved to help make the transition successful for your child as they embark on their educational journey.





Fraser Health's Topic for November is: Respiratory Season and Fall Immunizations

Protect children from respiratory illnesses this winter

Respiratory illnesses tend to increase as we spend more time indoors. Common colds, the flu and COVID-19 spread through tiny droplets as people who are sick breathe, talk, cough or sneeze. When other people touch these droplets and then their eyes, mouth or nose before washing their hands they may become sick. There are a handful of steps both children and adults can take to protect themselves and limit the spread of respiratory illnesses:







- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, mouth and nose.
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow.
- If you have symptoms, stay <u>home</u> and stay away from people at higher risk of serious illness.

Flu and COVID-19 vaccinations

The best way to protect others and reduce the risk of getting sick with the flu and COVID-19 is to get immunized. The flu and COVID-19 vaccines are safe, effective, and available for free to anyone aged six months and older.

It is much safer to get the vaccines than to get the illnesses. Register your children with the Get Vaccinated system so that you can be invited to book their vaccinations when they are due.
