

SD43 Middle School Book of the Year 2023


Our annual contest is back!


- Middle School Teacher Librarians have picked 10 finalists for Book of the Year.























Leadership Events:



THE LATEST FROM ART EXPO


Students in Mr. Walker's Art Expo classes recently had the opportunity to develop their painting skills by creating an apple in the likeness of those painted by the famous French Modernist painter Paul Cezanne. Considered by many to be the father of modern art, Cezanne's practice of painting mirrored the way we see, as opposed to what we see.

Students were tasked with producing their first apple based on their childhood memory of what an apple looked like. Then, after close scrutiny of an apple by Cezanne, students attempted to build the form of an apple in sequential layers of yellow, green and red, with hints of brown where needed. In this way, students were able to catch a glimpse of how colour and transparency come together to reveal the subtle nuances hidden in nature.















POLAR PLUNCH FOR SPECIAL OLYMPICS

ALLERGY AWARENESS

Cucumber and Watermelon Allergy



Please be advised that someone at EMMSOTA on Mondays and Thursdays has a severe allergy to cucumber and watermelon. For this reason, it would be helpful if you do not send cucumbers or watermelon with your students for their snack or lunch. To students and staff:

- If you have cucumber / watermelon in your lunch/snack please advise your teacher immediately (do not keep opened)
- If possible, refrain from eating/disposing of watermelon or cucumber inside eat and disposed of waste outdoors
- On inside days (plan for alternate place to eat snack/lunch if Lorenda is working with the class on that day)
- Please make sure to wash hands after touching, eating watermelon and/or cucumber (staff/students)

<u>SCENTS</u> - School District No. 43 (Coquitlam) buildings are scent aware facilities. In order to protect those individuals with fragrance sensitivities and to prevent others from developing such sensitivities, SD43 provides this information and asks for your cooperation towards a scent-reduced environment.

The district is asking for cooperation towards a scent reduced environment. All staff, students and visitors are strongly encouraged to avoid or reduce the use of fragranced products, and to replace them with unscented alternatives.

We recognize the personal right of individuals to use scented products. We believe, however, that this must be balanced with the adverse health effects and extreme discomfort that can be suffered by fragrance sensitive individuals.

This is not an issue about an individual disliking the smell of a particular perfume and not getting what he/she wants in the workplace. This is not a ban on scented products. This is a request to refrain from chemical-based scented products.

What can you do to help? • Be considerate of those who are sensitive to fragrance chemicals. Avoid or using scented products; instead, use unscented alternatives. • If you do use scented products, use them

sparingly. A general guideline for scented products is that the scent should not be detectable more than an arm's length away from you. Do not apply scented products in a public area. • Be an informed consumer. Read the product label. A product labeled as "fragrance-free" is likely to be free of fragrance chemicals. A product labeled as "scent-free" or "unscented" may mean that no fragrance chemicals have been added to the product, or it may be that a masking agent has been added to disguise the smell of some of the ingredients. These terms are not regulated, so use your nose or ask the store to check the product for fragrances. • Avoid using products (e.g. air fresheners or potpourris) that give off chemical-based scents in your work area. • Avoid using laundry products or cleaning agents that are scented. Air out dry-cleaned clothing before wearing.

AVOID PRODUCTS INCLUDING: ● Perfume ● Cologne ● Aftershave ● Deodorant ● Soap ● Shampoo ● Hairspray ● Body spray ● Makeup and powders ● Air fresheners ● Fabric softeners ● Laundry detergents ● Cleaners ● Carpet deodorizers ● Facial tissues ● Candles


