-Mr. Kolkea presented the teacher's wish list and spoke about items they feel would benefit the school. (Please see chart below for items and prices)

-Down the road the school may be able to acquire additional funding for being a school of the arts.

-Parents were curious if teachers hired had an art background. Not necessarily.

-It is the idea that PAC help support the new school of the art theme. Currently there was no request for things pertaining to science and such supplies.

-Mr. Kolkea spoke about the partnerships that the school is forming with community members. Three members of the community taking part in this process are Robert Randell, Cori Caulfield and Trent Arterberry.

-A key element to being a school of the arts for Moody will be becoming a Neighbourhood Learning Centre. For example Cori Caulfield is interested in having a dance space in the new school.

-Parents were questioning why Moody is not allocated additional funding now that they are a school of the arts and housing french immersion.

-There were concerns about how much instruction children were really receiving from the community partnership participants in comparison to the cost of them. (see chart below) -For technology one more documentation camera was required for each classroom to have their own.

-Any buses supplied by PAC will help to lower the cost of field trips for parents.

-Every child will participate in an art installation project (Mr. Zimmer). This will also help to brand the new pods.

-School magnets have been sent home. Mr. Kolkea noted that he has seen many in the kid's lockers.

-Gr. 6 gym bags have been ordered. The parents always like these and have received positive feedback.

-This year's literacy day looks like it will not have a guest speaker but will still do the drop everything and read event.

-Talk about the new school and what it might require. One known expense will be the new logo and the need for it to be painted on the gym floor, this expense is reflected in the budget.
