#### 1. The meeting was called to order at 6:35pm

#### 2. Approvals:

- a) A motion was made to adopt the minutes of the March PAC meeting, moved by Kara Crawford, seconded by Heather Skipworth, passed unanimously.

#### 3. Principal & Vice Principal's Reports

##### a) Principal's Report

There will be a presentation of learning on May 30<sup>th</sup> exploring the theme of change. It will provide a conclusion to the enquiry process learning about change, connecting to the journey of growth and change as a young person instead of interview. Typing up loose ends. The new logo on the spirit wear honours the past and looks forward by incorporating the historic fonts (Raiders, Mavericks). Thank you cards show casing student art are being used by the office.
