PRINCIPAL/VICE PRINCIPAL REPROTS

Principal - Tamara:

Another busy month and I'm still learning. I've enjoyed continuing to get to know the kids and surrounding community.

Great Halloween with fun activities.

Remembrance Day was acknowledged last week. Sr band, Student MCs, choir, video and speaker at the assembly. Processionals flags as well.

Coming up to Term 1 reporting. Report cards should go home towards last week of Dec. Before that is class reviews which Lindsay and I participated today and will again tomorrow.

This involves talking to all teachers in all Pods asking how we can support them in their action plan for learning.

Volleyball - games playing next week. Moody Middle is hosting a grade 8 tournament.

Student Leadership council has met at the district level and will take on new initiatives, including supporting Hazel Trembath School community and how we can all help.

Vice Principal - Lindsay:

Leadership program is doing 12 days of giving — food collection — leading up to Christmas break.

Another group will be making food and supplementing the breakfast program. Could also supplement the lunch program.

Very busy at school and we are all looking forward to the Christmas season. Book Fair started today! Lots of excitement around that from the kids. It's open a little bit before school, lunch time and a little bit after school for the week of Nov 14-17

BUDGET for 2023/24: See attached

Tamara submitted her proposal at the last meeting. PAC exec has since met to discuss and have finalized that list. Most are the same except for two differences...

- 1. Year end Sasamat Lake school field trip gaming grant for buses* to the lake only. No money for the BBQ.
- 2. Grade 8 leaving ceremony there is a separate committee that will run a fundraiser or two. PAC will give up to \$1000 to support this if needed.

Questions to Tamara — what is the school planning to do for the Grade 8s?

Tamara:

- Leaving ceremony in the gym, but also to have a separate lunch in for the kids. Last year was pizza and cake.
- Maybe this year do a little bit more. Gym decoration and activities for kids (?)
- Would like to keep the core parts of the leaving ceremony the same every year for the kids.
- If the committee raises (for example) \$1000 this year, but only \$500 the next, I want to see the amount spent is kept the same in the end.
- So the quality of the graduation isn't dependent upon how much is raised by the Leaving Committee.
- Cake or cupcakes afterwards provided by school.
- Luncheon provided by committee and PAC (?)
- Open to another dance or other activity determined by this year's Leaving Committee.

The PAC would give UP TO (but not exceeding) \$1000 towards the activities if needed. Last year fundraising and donations totalled almost \$1400, and expenses were about \$1600, so PAC covered about \$200

^{*} Sasamat buses will depend on how much of gaming grant is spent during the year.

Overall expenses could go up every year depending on food costs and inflation.

Ceremony, decorations, lunch and cake/cupcakes and activities for kids. What should be done every year? The activity will change depending on the committee.

The committee will be formed soon once a callout goes home by email.

Other budget items from Tamara's list were slightly tweaked, but most stayed as is.

Question — A parent asked about decorations. She is willing to help even though she's not a grade 8 parent. Help to find items if needed.

If no other questions or objections, *Kimiko motioned to pass the PAC budget for 2023/24 school year.*

4. Assistant Superintendent's Report

- Nadine Tambellini

- SD43 enrollment is up, over 650 new students.
- Increases felt all over metro Vancouver. Hazel Trembath 250 students displaced by fire, and moved to Winslow building. Poco community, district staff and school community moved swiftly into the temporary location.
- Craig Mah SD43 and Jodie Moss: Reporting Framework for secondary students:
- Aligns with new curriculum: Competency driven, personalized and flexible, focus on literacy and numeracy foundations and Indigenous perspectives, worldviews and woven into all areas of learning areas and grades.
- Had not been updated since 1994. Report cards will focus on learning instead of competing for marks. What is consistent, 5 reporting events, 3 written and 2 informal reports. Letter grades and percentages 10-12, written feedback K-9, student self-assessment of Core Competencies K-9. Student self-assessment included in 10-12 now. Emerging, means beginning to understand. Developing, means they're understanding some things. Proficient is the goal for your child. Extending: when students show a full understanding.
- Q: Will Grade 9 proficiency scales affect university of college entrance:
- A: Each university maintains their own internal evaluators. All post-secondary institutions worldwide have their own entrance processing for letter grades and proficiency scales. The Ministry of education and childcare has worked closely with NCAA which looks at grade 9 grades and they have process for accepting the proficiency scale.
- Q: What is the Insufficient Evidence? IE?
- A: Parents informed upfront, only when the teacher does not have enough observations to give evidence of learning.

- Transcending: What can I do, as a bystander, to make a difference?
- Do an actual training on how to use Naloxone. Overdose is the leading cause of death for people 10-59 in BC!
