#### 3. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

- Getting ready for spring break and parent-teacher conferences
- Kids training for Como Lake relays
- Starting up the articulation process for Scott Creek visit
- Satisfaction surveys for Grade 4 students starting up as well; will get information on this in future

- Anticipating 32 K students; 41 grade 5 students leaving; numbers are down 221 now and projecting 207; hoping not going to lose a division; 41 Grade 4s
- Hoping to know about international students after spring break; international brings extra staffing and student services and extra funds; good for students to meet other kids from other cultures as well
- Final numbers will go to school district in April and then will get staffing base/funding
- Raised by PAC President: have been hearing about bears and cougars; did give a
  P.A. announcement to kids about following the air horn instructions and to come
  into the school if they hear the air horn blow 3 times
- Question raised re: garbage in the playground: kids play beyblades during lunch on garbage bin lids; have reminded kids about using garbage bins and there have been fights over beyblades; and older grades 5 don't show as much leadership but also segregated from younger kids. After spring break, planning to ban beyblades and also de-segregate kids to foster leadership and promote positive interaction; would like to bring in more playground games and equipment to promote more interactive play; it's also up to the parents to help educate kids
- Buddy bench waiting for school district to come to school for installation
- Question raised: How is the buddy bench being installed? Who is paying? This
  was a past topic and cost was very high. Principal contacted head of
  maintenance to help with install and scoping out the space
- Work order to re-paint lines in parking lot was put in by Kate a while back
