## **Intellectual Development**

Goal: Literacy: To increase student interest in reading.

#### Rationale:

Teachers notice a reluctance for student to embrace reading. Many parents also report that their children prefer screen time. Literacy report card marks shows this as area of emerging focus for Mountain View

#### Planned Actions:

Develop a class library with support from PAC. Purchase class sets of high interest books. Plan school wide events such as Book Character Day. Drop Everything And Read as a regular event. Host school reading events.

#### Indicators of Success:

Grade Four Student Learning Survey 58% of students agreed with the statement. "I feel I am getting better at reading."
Staff will also monitor student engagement and the types of books being read.

#### School Community Engagement Process:

Mountain View will share information in monthly newsletter about strategies to increase reading engagement at home. Exciting contests such as Read Do to increase student engagement.

Updates will be provided at PAC meetings.

## **Human and Social Development**

#### Area of focus:

Increase the students understanding of the relationship between food, energy and learning.

#### Planned Actions:

Monitor bell schedule and student eating time. At Mountain View for lunch time, students play first and then eat when they return to the classroom to eat under the supervision of the teacher. Mountain View students appear to be coming to school with lunches, although much appears to be processed foods. School will also monitor late arrivals.

The school offers healthy snacks for students who become hungry during the day.

#### Indicators of Success:

Mountain View had success with the previous sleep goal (per MDI and SLS data) that we are moving to a new focus this year. 50% of Grade 4 students report they eat junk food 2-4 times a week.


Teacher observation of class discussions and also monitoring any food waste. The school will also monitor Grade 4 responses on the annual MDI and SLS survey

#### School Community Engagement Process:

Information regarding the healthy relationship between food, energy and learning will be emphasized in newsletters and PAC meetings.

School assemblies will also include a healthy eating component.

The school will promote the Fruits and Veggies program and monthly PAC Hot Lunch days.

#### Planned Actions:

Utilize Youth Worker to connect with as many students as possible. Set up a bulletin board highlighting all staff. Showcase staff at large gatherings so students become familiar with them.


#### Indicators of Success:

MDI results show 71% of Grade 4 students feel they have 2 or more important adults. Although this is an improvement, it is still under the district average. Responses in the Student Learning Survey shows 83% of students feel there are 2 or more adults that care. This is a significant improvement from previous years. The MDI and SLS will be the main indicators of success.

#### School Community Engagement Process:

School strategies will be shared in monthly newsletters.

All large gatherings and assemblies will begin with a tradition welcome and land acknowledgment of the Kwikwetlem First Nation.

Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving: Analyzing plot twists, character motivations, and complex narratives sharpens students' critical thinking skills. They learn to evaluate information and draw conclusions.

Lifelong Learning Habits: Cultivating interest in reading during school years establishes a habit that often continues into adulthood. Lifelong readers stay informed, curious, and adaptable.
