5. PRESIDENT'S REPORT – PAC President: Shirley Low

a) PAC Feedback Survey Results – Nov 2024 (refer to Appendix A)

Thank you to all the parents that submitted a response- 22 responses. Below is a quick summary:

- Over 90% are satisfied with frequency and content of email communications
- ~75% are satisfied with Munch a Lunch (hot lunch platform)
- Over 50% are aware of our Facebook Page for updates and info
- Lots of fundraising and events ideas were shared and will be reviewed and discussed by executives and eventually, the school. If there are any ideas that the parent community would like to initiate and organize, please reach out to <u>mountainviewpac740@gmail.com</u>.

- For PAC meetings, attendance is still low due to time and meeting dates not being convenient or not having time for parents to attend/commit to. There is a preference for virtual meetings. We will revisit this before the start of next school year as we do want to increase attendance rates to include more parents in discussions.
- Some feedback suggesting parent workshop. PAC will aim to provide more awareness regarding DPAC workshops and school district workshops.

b) Playground project updated quote of \$25K for new 4 seater swing set *(refer to Appendix B)*

Habitat Systems (vendor) replied back with site prep costs (~\$15K). Hence, with cost of the new swing set and GST, it will be total of ~\$25K.

Options: Look into keeping current swing set and potentially add one new set? Grants: possible grants for schools and Coquitlam residents Lisa to talk to school district - TBC

6. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – Mountain View Principal: Lisa Salloum

Great feedback and appreciation from teachers and the school for all the December events. Teachers inquired if Popcorn days will return, and Tracey confirmed this will commence again. Field trip proposals have been submitted to Lisa for review – in progress.

7. RECAP OF DECEMBER EVENTS

a) Christmas Concert Concession (Thurs, Dec 12) - Radu Pop

Over \$500 was raised. This year we aimed to reduce food wastage and tried with food pre-orders via Munch a Lunch (cotton candy and charcuterie cups). It was overall successful, where everything was sold. We also had McDonalds donate a carafe of coffee and COBS bread via Mr. Chan donated some pastries. These items were by donation and this worked well. Little waste, great success!

Thank you to all the volunteers that were there to help set up the concession stand and

to sell throughout the concert. Gratitude to Radu for all his time and efforts for making this happen!

Opportunities: earlier pro-order next year, to give more opportunities to order for the concert. Idea brought up to raffle off front row seats next year.

b) In Classroom Holiday Activity – Cookie Decorating (Wed, Dec 18) – Keith Cassidy Original budget allotted \$400 / Final cost \$496, but school will cover for \$96 (icing, etc.)

Cookies were sourced from a local baker and would recommend working with them again next year. This year we split the icing with the help of volunteers (thank you to all of you that helped). For day of event, there was some confusion and concerns regarding the clean-up, parent participation, and peanut allergies. Much thanks to Janice and Keith for taking the lead and organizing this event for us!

Next year, we would recommend addressing those concerns during the planning process and paying the nominal fee to have icing divvied up by the baker instead.

c) Santa's Pancake Breakfast (Thurs, Dec 19) – Tracey Carolan

Great success, went seamless. First year with all grades in the gym at the same time, as more tables were set up this year. Thank you to Tracey for heading this event for the past years she has been here with us at Mountain View. She has prepped this event to streamline it for years to come.

a) Scheduled monthly hot lunches for Jan through June

United Way will invite community member and services to attend to expose new parents and immigrants in our community to more resources, while providing a free stuff animal making activity sourced from Par-T Pets for children. Registration will be required and must also be opened to public in our neighbourhood. More details to come.






How satisfied are you with the <u>frequency</u> of email communications from the PAC?

How satisfied are you with the <u>content/information</u> provided in the email communications from the PAC?







How satisfied are you with our current hot lunch ordering platform - "Munch a Lunch"?

[SECTION 2] Share your opinions and ideas

Do you have any fundraising ideas or suggestions that the PAC should consider?

- Suddenly a way to raise funds could be to have some t-shirts made with the logo and name of the school. I think that both parents and children would like to have some clothing that represents the school.
- Coffee ready to drink for parents. Popcorn was fun.
- Purdy's, pie fundraisers were a hit
- Hosting our own sports team tournaments and inviting other school teams or perhaps school dances (e.g. Halloween), family movie nights. It would be a great opportunity to set up a concession stand to fundraise as well as build community.
- A raffle.
- More hot lunches per month, if possible.
- 50/50 tickets for prizes, cookie dough sale, read-a-thon, silent auction (parents donate items that can be auctioned off), school talent show (charge an entry fee), car wash
- Silent Auction Gather donated items from local businesses and parents, then host a silent auction online or during a school event. Proceeds go directly to the PAC. Movie Night Host a family movie night in the gym or multipurpose room. Sell tickets, popcorn, drinks, and snacks for additional fundraising.
- Just more hot lunch days? Maybe a fundraiser for adults like a trivia night? Movie night for families in the gym?
- A fair with games and food for sale, in which each family buys tickets in advance to participate.
- I'd like to see more useful/practical fundraising such as meat orders.
- Tri-cities entertainment books
- How about a mini market? Are kids allowed to set up a mini market in the gym and each class
 "sells" a product or service? For example: one class sells lemonade, another class sells
 bookmarks made by students, another class can host games, sell popcorn, or do a garage sale,
 etc. Kind of like a christmas/night market? Might be fun to involve the students and teaches kids
 about running a business. Maybe students who can play instruments or dance can do a
 performance together. This might encourage students who have special skills and talents to
 showcase their skills and inspire other kids. Parents can support by paying a small admission fee
 (small fee like \$2 or by donation) and buying the goods/services.
- YMCA membership deals
- Bring the coupon book back! English Bay cookie dough sale/ Another movie night or bowling night/ Parent pub night/ Popcorn and freezie after school

We'd love to hear your ideas! Are there any new events or activities you'd like the PAC to organize for the remainder of the school year?

- Yes, I would like us to be able to encourage and support field trips more.
- Spring/summer sports activities or more of popcorn/freezie sales.
- Christmas crafts for the kids.
- Bringing in a Dance or sports instructor.
- Class field trips, movie night, fire station/police station visits, magician shows, dance performance shows, multicultural performances (learn about different cultures)
- Parent Education Nights Host workshops or guest speakers on topics like online safety, bullying prevention, parenting strategies, or mental health awareness. Financial Literacy : many financial institutions provide this service. This is key for children to learn about at an early age. Community Coffee Mornings Offer casual coffee and conversation mornings for parents to connect, share ideas, and build community ties.
- Movie night for families? Valentines family dance?
- It would be interesting if the children could attend or bring a musical concert.
- Craft fair, movie nights
- 1. I'd love for the kids to learn more about giving and helping others. How about writing letters to other children who are in the hospital (like pen pals) or to nursing homes?

2. How about collecting stories written by students and turning it into books? I think we can use printing shops to do this. Students can become authors and if we want, we can even get it published. We can involve the older students to write the stories and these students can perhaps read these stories to the younger students.





Developing strong fundamentals in any sport at an early age is crucial for their growth and success, both on and off the field.

- New Wood Borders = \$4,700

- 2 bays = \$2,510 + \$1,881 = \$4,391
- 4 swing seats = \$353 x 4 = \$1,412
- Freight = \$1500
- Install = \$2800

2024 INITIAL QUOTE TOTAL: \$23,853 + GST (5%) = \$25,045.65.

Unfortunately, the site prep cost stays the same regardless of the component. We will see an increase in the new year (2025) so if I account for that the cost is **\$24,285 + GST = \$25,499.25**.

The site prep, remove/dispose and new borders/ EWF are roughly \$13,591 so for \$15,000 unfortunately I do not have anything we can offer. My suggestion would be to have the school lean on the district and see if they will cover some of the site prep costs.

I have seen grants issued from \$2,000 / \$4500 / \$10,000 or even up to \$100,000 so it all depends on the project and the grant that you are applying for.
