



What's Happening at Mundy Road

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Next week, Wednesday February 26th is Pink Shirt Day. Pink Shirt day started in 2007 when a student was bullied for wearing a pink shirt. Two grade 12 students witnessed this and wanted to help. They bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged classmates to wear pink. Now students across the country wear pink on February 26th to raise awareness about being kind.

Bullying is a serious issue that affects some children. It is defined as a consistent pattern of unwelcome or aggressive behavior that causes physical and/or emotional harm to others. It's important to understand that bullying is **not** the same as mean behavior or a conflict between peers. To identify bullying, three key indicators are typically present:

1. Power: Bullying involves a real or perceived power imbalance. Those who bully often gain power through physical size, strength, or status within the peer group. They may also gain power by garnering support from others.
2. Frequency: Bullying is not a random or one-time action. It is repetitive and can instill fear in the victim, leading to long-term negative effects.



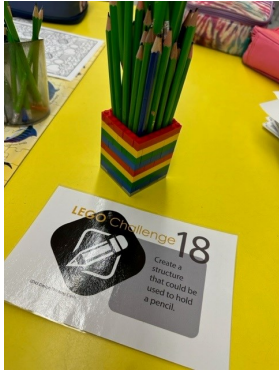
Intent to Harm: Individuals who bully typically aim to cause physical or emotional harm to their target. They deliberately say or do hurtful things without remorse and continue even when their actions are known to cause harm or when asked to stop.

Mundy Road has been encouraging students to demonstrate their kindness this month and participate in real acts of care. Students have been reflecting on their own acts of kindness and those of their peers. 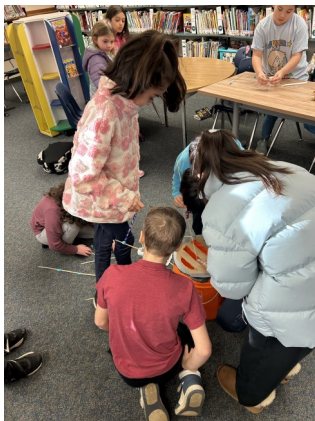

[MyEducation BC: Log On \(gov.bc.ca\)](http://MyEducation BC: Log On (gov.bc.ca)) this is the “family portal” where you will see Learning Updates (*formally called report cards*) this account requires you to change your password every three months. We suggest logging in to set it up prior to December so you can see your child’s learning update right away.

Did you know you can pick up a waiver form at the office for your criminal record check? This waives the fee at the RCMP.
