Kid's Christmas/Holiday Market Wed Dec 1st, 2010

Hello to parents and guardians of Mundy Road students!

The planning for the fourth annual Kid's Christmas/Holiday Market is well underway.

What is it? This event is meant to be an affordable, fun way for students to surprise their family members and other special people in their lives, with parent donated shopping items they pick out, pay for and have wrapped at school. This event cannot be a success without your help! The staff at Mundy Road has decided, with the help of interested parents, to sponsor a Coquitlam family this year that wouldn't be having a "Christmas" without our help. All proceeds from this event will help sponsor this family at Christmas as well as others in need if funds allow.

What do I donate as a parent?

Please keep in mind the kids will be shopping for mom, dad, grandparents, siblings and other special people, so a variety of gifts is appreciated for all family members. We are looking for new and very gently used, CLEAN items to be donated. Some examples of gifts are candles, candle holders, wine glass tags, Christmas/non Christmas mugs, individually wrapped specialty coffee/teas, hot chocolate, Christmas ornaments, bath stuff (soaps, oils, etc), golf balls, golf tees, chocolates, candies, adult/kids books, play doh, videos, cd's, cd cases, lego, comics, and toys/items that your own children have outgrown but are still in great shape and waiting to be played with by someone else. Please make sure that items are clean and complete.

This is a great time to clean out the closets, make some space for yourself, pass on some great items that others will be able to enjoy AND contribute to giving a Coquitlam family an extra special Christmas. That's more than a win/win situation.

We suggest you leave a box or bag somewhere handy and add items each day as you organize each room in the house. We all have items in the bathroom, kitchen, living room, "gift box" etc. that we do not use but would make great gifts for others. Ask your child(ren) for help and get them involved. They will enjoy passing on items they have outgrown or no longer play with as they clean up their room. This is the perfect time to "regift" any new items that you don't need.

With a little effort, you will be amazed at what you can dig up in your own home. Please try and send at least as many items as people your child(ren) will be shopping for. Some children might need "suggestions" ahead of time as to what they might look for a certain person, but please remember, it is their chance to shop and should be their decision. This event is meant to be a fun and affordable way for the children to surprise their family members at Christmas. Most items will be priced at under \$5.00 with the majority of those at \$2.00 or less.

Wrapping: So the children can bring home gifts ready to be placed under the tree, we are also looking for donations of gift tags(which are always in short supply) gift and cellophane bags are preferred but also gift wrap, tissue, small boxes, bubble wrap, tape refills for dispensers and plastic shopping bags. We have plenty of bows already this year. If you are donating breakables, a suitable box, it would be MUCH appreciated.

If possible, please send your donations to your child's classroom on Friday Nov 26th or Monday Nov 29th. We will continue to accept donations until the morning of Wed Dec 1st but would really appreciate the bulk of donations on Friday or Monday so we can start sorting and pricing these items.

When is the event? Wed Dec 1st during school hours. Students will participate at designated times (to be announced) throughout the afternoon and should bring smaller change ie; quarters, loonies, and toonies (no \$10's or \$20's please) to pay for their items. This is a good opportunity for the students to expand on their understanding of money.

Parents, older siblings not attending Mundy Road and staff are invited to shop AFTER the students have had first choice at all the treasures (ie; after school). NO EARLY BIRDS PLEASE as this is an opportunity for students to shop for loved ones! Everyone is welcome and encouraged to shop from approximately 2:45-3:15pm, however, giftwrapping will no longer be able. You will be amazed by what is overlooked by the students and still left at the end of the day.

Teachers/Parents: Perhaps you could suggest that the students ask if they can do "extra" chores at home to earn some spending money for the market. Talk to your children about who is going to be helped by the money raised. See, it really is a win/win situation! Please remind your children that they are NOT shopping for themselves but other family members and friends. Talk about a number of items that might be suitable for certain people so that the children have a bit of direction of what to look for and yet have the option to choose themselves. Prepare a list if that helps.

Want to help out more?

Extra hands will be needed to sort and price items, set up tables, wrap items, accept money etc. If you would like to help out with this event either on the day of or Monday Nov 29/Tuesday Nov 30, please contact Ingrid at 604-936-2611 or davitt@telus.net. All items will be brought into the gym the morning of the event (Wednesday Dec 1) so even 15 minutes of your time is a HUGE help. At least 25 volunteers are needed this day to reduce line ups at the wrapping area and to help with sales. It is a great, fun but exhausting day. Come for the day if you can or a few hours if that is what you can spare. If you haven't had a chance to volunteer at this event yet, please try to do so this year and if you have, please come back again- we need you!

Thanks to everyone in advance for your involvement in making this a fun event for the children and for helping out a Coquitlam family. After all, isn't that what Christmas is really about!

Also, if you are interested in shopping, wrapping etc. for the sponsor family, please let me know. I plan to donate wrapped sox and toques for the homeless and will need assistance wrapping those as well.

I work for the Downtown Community Health Clinic run by Vancouver Coastal. We are located on Princess and Powell Street, right in the heart of the Downtown Eastside. We bring donations directly into our clinic, sort through them and give them directly to people who come in off of the street. Our clinic has doctors, nurses, TB clinic, lab, HIV clinic, Hep B clinic, community workers, counseling, dieticians, pharmacy, home support and more all within our space. It is an amazing place run by amazing people, and donations are greatly appreciated. I would love to collect seasonally appropriate **ADULT MEN'S AND LADIES'** clothing items, including jackets, socks, pants, shirts, toques, gloves. They must be clean. Blankets are another huge item, as well as decent shoes. Once the feet get wet the body can't get warm, so dry **socks and shoes** are a must, along with coats. Any help would be greatly appreciated. We have just handed out our last coat and the shelters do not open until November. The nights are getter colder. Please bring all blanket/clothing donations to the office in bags labelled "Clothing donations" or drop off at Christine's house located at 1950 Edgewood Ave.

PLEASE put clothes in drive way beside the chimney under the eaves.
