#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Throughout this fall I have been able to work in many classes with students as well as supervise on the playground and in the gym. It has been my privilege to be read to by our newest readers in grade 1, serenaded by students who are bursting with musical energy, asked to play games during lunch hour in classrooms and on the playground. I have learned new "rules" of an invented game and are impressed by the enthusiasm of students at all grades. The learning that takes place in the structure of a classroom is vital to students, as is the social learning that takes place on the playground during our recess and lunch time.

Whether they are outside or inside during these break times, students are still learning. The playground learning is around how to interact with others in a democratic and reasonable manner - or simply put: 'play fair, be nice'. It has been a statement echoed across playgrounds for many years, and likely was heard by many of us growing up when we dealt with a sibling who was causing some squabble at home. It is still an outcome we strive for in our school community, in and out of the classrooms. We hope that students of all ages learn to strengthen their collaborative skills, continue to learn how to compromise with each other, establish fairness when taking turns, think about equality when in disagreement with a classmate and how to express oneself so that both parties feel heard and respected.

Our Remembrance Day Assembly was held this morning and students were incredibly attentive and respectful. Throughout the presentations by fellow Mundy Road students, they listened and were focused. The somber tone of the assembly was understood as students remained very still during our Minute of Silence and during 'Last Post'. Many of the parents and guests who attended today's assembly commented on the outstanding behaviour of all our students – and for some of students who are not yet 5 years of age, this is not always easy to do! For our older students who waited patiently to be dismissed demonstrated thoughtful awareness of this assembly and the meaning of Remembrance Day. Today we had a wonderful experience in respect – and for those in our audience, I am sure you agree as we were all very, very proud of our Mundy Road students!

During our school day we strive to teach students the importance of fair play, ways to be inclusive with others and to treat each other with respect – all good lessons in life. We know that parents and caregivers support these lessons, as students come to school quite familiar with those themes.

Please congratulate your child(ren) on their awareness of today's assembly - they were fantastic!

# Kid's Christmas Market Wed Nov 30<sup>th</sup> 2011

Hello to parents and guardians of Mundy Road students! Planning for the MUNDY ROAD's fifth annual **Kid's Christmas/Holiday Market** is well underway.

What is it? This event is meant to be an affordable, fun students to surprise their family members and other people in their lives, with parent donated shopping items

out, pay for and have wrapped at school. This event cannot be a success without your help! All proceeds raised from this event will help a Coquitlam family who wouldn't be having a "Christmas" without our help as well as others in need if funds allow.

#### What do I donate as a parent?

Please keep in mind the kids will be shopping for mom, dad, grandparents, siblings and other special people, so a variety of gifts is appreciated for all family members. We are looking for new and **very gently used**, **CLEAN** items to be donated. Some examples of gifts are candles, candle holders, wine glass tags, Christmas/non Christmas mugs, individually wrapped specialty coffee/teas, hot chocolate, Christmas ornaments, bath stuff (soaps, oils, etc), kitchen gadets, golf balls, golf tees, ties, gloves, picture frames, chocolates, candies, adult/kids books, play doh, videos, cd's, cd cases, lego, comics, and toys/items that your own children have outgrown but are still in great shape and waiting to be played with by someone else. Please make sure that items are **clean and complete**. Basically we are looking for any clean, complete item you are willing to donate. You are only limited by your imagination. **Please make an extra effort to donate items suitable for dads/males**.

This is a great time to clean out the closets, make some space for yourself, pass on some great items that others will be able to enjoy AND contribute to giving a Coquitlam family an extra special Christmas. That's more than a win/win situation.

We suggest you leave a box or bag somewhere handy and add items each day as you organize each room in the house. We all have items in the bathroom, kitchen, living room, "gift box" etc. that we do not use but would make great gifts for others. Ask your child(ren) for help and get them involved. They will enjoy passing on items they have outgrown or no longer play with as they clean up their room.

This is the perfect time to "regift" any new items that you don't need.

With a little effort, you will be amazed at what you can dig up in your own home. Please try and send at least as many items as people your child(ren) will be shopping for. Some children might need "suggestions" ahead of time as to what they might look for for a certain person, but please remember, it is their chance to shop and should be their decision. This event is meant to be a fun and affordable way for the children to surprise their family members at Christmas. Most items will be priced at under \$5.00 with the majority of those at \$2.00 or less.

**Wrapping:** So the children can bring home gifts ready to be placed under the tree, we are also looking for donations of **gift tags**(which are always in short supply) **gift and cellophane bags** are preferred but also gift wrap, tissue, small boxes, bubble wrap, **tape** refills for dispensers and plastic shopping bags. We have plenty of bows already this year. If you are donating breakables, a suitable box, it would be MUCH appreciated.

If possible, please send your donations to your child's classroom or by the office on Friday Nov 25<sup>th</sup> or Monday Nov 28th. We will continue to accept donations until the morning of Wed Nov 30<sup>th</sup> but would really appreciate the bulk of donations on Friday or Monday so we know if we are short on donations and can start sorting and pricing the items we do have.

When is the event? Wed Nov 30th during school hours. Students will participate at designated times (to be announced) throughout the school day and should bring smaller change ie; quarters, loonies, and toonies (no \$10's or \$20's please) to pay for their items. This is a good opportunity for the students to expand on their understanding of money. Please bring a bag to carry home your treasures as well and send extra bags if you have any.

Parents, older siblings not attending Mundy Road and staff are invited to shop AFTER the students have had first choice at all the treasures (ie; after school or closer to 2:15pm EXACT TIME TBA). NO EARLY BIRDS PLEASE as this is an opportunity for students to shop for loved ones! Everyone is welcome and encouraged to shop from approximately 2:15-2:45pm, however, giftwrapping will -no longer be able. You may be amazed by what is overlooked by the students and still left at the end of the day.

Teachers/Parents: Perhaps you could suggest that the students ask if they can do "extra" chores at home to earn some spending money for the market. Talk to your children about who is going to be helped by the money raised. See, it really is a win/win situation! Please remind your children that they are NOT shopping for themselves but other family members and friends. Talk about a number of items that might be suitable for certain people so that the children have a bit of direction of what to look for and yet have the option to choose themselves. Prepare a list if that helps.

#### Want to help out more?

Extra hands will be needed to sort and price items, set up tables, wrap items, accept money etc. If you would like to help out with this event **either on the day of or Monday Nov 28/Tuesday Nov 29**, please contact Ingrid at 604-936-2611 or <u>davitt@telus.net</u>. All items will be brought into the gym the morning of the event (Wednesday Nov 30<sup>th</sup>) to set up for the event so even 15 minutes of your time is a HUGE help. At least 25 volunteers are needed this day to reduce line ups at the wrapping area and to help with sales. It is a great, fun but exhausting day. Come for the day if you can or a few hours if that is what you can spare. If you haven't had a chance to volunteer at this event yet, please try to do so this year and if you have, please come back again- **we need you**! If you have smaller children, perhaps you can trade off with another parent who will mind the kids while you work at the market. WE NEED VOLUNTEERS TO reduce the line ups for wrapping and to help sell etc. We want children to bring home wrapped gifts and that is not possible without many hands.

Thanks to everyone in advance for your involvement in making this a fun event for the children and for helping out a Coquitlam family. After all, isn't that what Christmas is really about! Also, if you are interested in shopping, wrapping etc. for the sponsor family, please let me know. I plan to donate wrapped sox and toques for the homeless and will need assistance wrapping those as well.

THIS IS MY 5<sup>TH</sup> AND FINAL YEAR RUNNING THE MARKET SO IF YOU WANT TO SEE THIS GREAT TRADITION CONTINUE, now is the time to get your feet wet to see what the market is all about and perhaps think about running with it next year.

Many of the students will have an opportunity to make gift bags for the market over the next month during lunch or recess and perhaps during class time. The giftbags will be put into a pool of giftbags to help reduce the wrap time. If you have any supplies you would like to donate (brown paper lunch bags, glitter glue, stickers, foam pieces etc. please sent them to the office marked "for Kids Christmas Market gift bag making supplies" or if that is too long to write, how about have some fun at home and make them there and send them in.
