Principal's Message:

We're already 7 weeks into the school year and we've been very fortunate to have had some wonderfully crisp and sunny weather! Children are thoroughly enjoying the use of the grass fields on those sunny days. Our Full Day Kindergarten students are actively exploring the primary playground with a lunch hour supervisor and plenty of grade 5 students assisting during their playtime outside. Students have enjoyed the Hot Lunch Days and, of course, the famous Popcorn Treat Days. We've included all the scheduled Hot Lunch Days and Popcorns Days in the calendar that follows at the end of this newsletter so you can mark those dates down in your home calendar.

As many of you know, our PAC has been dedicated to providing extras for Mundy Road Students. One of the focus items was to replace the 'Adventure Playground' as it slowly deteriorating and it would eventually have to be removed. The PAC took heed and committed itself to fundraising for a replacement playground for students. Through their focused initiatives, time and effort, Mundy Road students received a 'Space Net' last fall. It is a well used, much appreciated climbing apparatus for students in our community.

Within the last few weeks, there has been great excitement! The Playground Committee had submitted a Grant Proposal to the City of Coquitlam last spring and they were informed very recently that Mundy Road Elementary was successful in securing Grant funds for the playground! Under the umbrella of Parks, Recreation and Culture Services, 2011 Spirit of Coquitlam and Active Grant Programs dedicated just over \$20,000 for playground structures. This will allow the final phase of the playground to be completed this year! Stay tuned for further exciting news regarding when the playground will be installed. Many congratulations go to the Mundy Road Playground Committee for all their time, energy and dedication to a new playground at Mundy Road, as well as to all our parents who have supported the myriad of fundraising events.

To follow on this note, the PAC group supported the purchase of more technology and the school committed to also purchasing some technology and together we now have 3 SMART Boards at Mundy Road! These boards are in 3 areas; a primary class, an intermediate class and the library. Students are very excited by what they have seen so far – and we're only at the beginning of the year! Staff and students are very appreciative of the PAC initiatives all they do to support our school!

Some of our teachers attended the summer technology professional development courses at UBC on SMART Boards – and some of the teachers who don't have SMART Boards in their classrooms also attended. Many of our teachers are involved in their own personal professional development, after school, on SMART Boards. We are fortunate to have our District's Technology Coordinator as our facilitator/instructor for this year, and many of us will be attending a series of these professional development workshops over the course of this school year. We are looking forward to gaining knowledge and abilities in using a SMART Board as a classroom learning tool.

The Province of BC has invited schools, hospitals, businesses and major corporations to join them on the 'Great Shake Out' which is a Earthquake Drill that is province wide. Mundy Road is participating this Thursday, October 20th, at 10:20 am, and while we have already done both our first Earthquake and Fire Drill, we think it will be a great exercise for all of us in practicing what to do in case of an emergency.

Thanks to Mrs. Wood and the group of teachers who assisted with the Terry Fox Run this year. Currently our total for donations to the Terry Fox Foundation is running close to \$1100 not including the online donations. The weather held for us and while it was a bit chilly for spectators, we appreciated all the parents and extended family and friends who came to cheer on Mundy Road runners!

This information is used to contact you in the event that your child is ill or injured.

Closure of Schools for Extreme Weather Conditions

In the case of extreme weather conditions such as ice, wind and/or excessive snowfall, the Superintendent of Schools has authority on behalf of the Board, to temporarily close a school.

As a general expectation, parents should assume that schools are open. If parents believe the local conditions are unsafe, they should keep their child at home or arrange his/her early dismissal. If schools are to be closed before morning classes begin, an announcement will be made on local radio stations CKNW (980), CKWX (1130) and CBC (690) by 7:30 am if possible.
