Principal's Message

As we begin October we can look back at a busy September and be happy that we have had a successful start to the school year.

Our school population has grown again this year. We projected a school population of 1490 students in May and at the end of September Pinetree has an enrollment of 1540 students. In September, school staff worked hard to make sure all students had schedules for their classes and made adjustments for those that needed them for graduation or University entrance. Our staff did a great deal of work on course planning and scheduling in the spring to minimize the changes in September. This was necessary as the school had to adjust to the revised class size and composition language in the collective agreement for teachers. By working hard in the spring the school was able to limit the number of classes that were not in compliance for September.

With Pinetree's increased enrollment the school has received additional staffing for the year. We have been able to increase the teaching time of Ms. Hyatt Shaw to full time for the school year and we will be hiring two teachers for second semester to help with pressures in our timetable.

Students have already begun to become involved in the many opportunities available at Pinetree outside of regular classes. Volleyball, cross country and boys soccer are in full swing with teams already competing for Pinetree. Clubs at Pinetree have begun this year with our annual club fair the last week of September. If your daughter or son missed this opportunity, it is never too late. They can watch for signs and notices through our daily HOWL announcements.

Grade 12 students have their first grad event this week on October 4th. Over 260 students will travel by bus to Vancouver for an evening cruising the Vancouver harbor for our Pinetree Senior Sail. This is one of three events Pinetree has traditionally had for graduating students. These grad events are a privilege for students. We have taken time in September and this week to remind all of our grade 12 students that all school expectations/school code of conduct rules apply and that students who breach the school code of conduct on this event will be putting their participation in future grad events in jeopardy.

Our first interim report card will be coming home mid next week on Wednesday October 11th. This interim report is simply a snapshot of your child's progress in the first five weeks of school. Marks are not included in this interim report card. The first formal report card will be coming home in mid-November and this report will have more details of your child's progress.

We are already enjoying the start of another great year!

- **Don't Rush to "I Can't"** When people start a new task, or are doing one that is very difficult, it is sometimes tempting to say "I can't do this" or "I can't be bothered". With a bit of effort, you might surprise yourself by how well you can do the task and how much you enjoy it.
- The Power of "Yet" This simple word can have a big impact. There is a huge difference between saying "I am not good at this" and "I am not good at this yet". By adding the word "yet", it suggests you may get there with some hard work and resilience.
- Ask Yourself "What would I do differently next time?" This is a great question to ask after a setback. It stops you dwelling on the past and helps you reflect and focus on what you need to improve on in the future.
- Failing Better Everyone experiences failure at some stage in their life. But can you fail better? This doesn't mean failing more often. One way to fail better is if you ask someone for feedback and then use it.








THE GREAT BC SHAKE OUT DRILL—OCTOBER 19
