Dear Pinetree Families:

Ms. Korby, one of our Languages teachers, is organizing the bi-annual European study tour of Spain and France in July 2018. This is an educational trip to Europe. The main goal is to improve students' language skills and self confidence abroad while obtaining a unique first-hand look at the culture and people of the places visited. Spain and France were selected as destinations because French and Spanish are two of the languages taught at our school; students will have the opportunity to immerse themselves in the culture of these two languages.

They will stay with trusted families, all of which have had background checks by Police, the international schools and by C.S.L.I. Tours. Students will stay in groups of 2, 3 or 4 per family, allowing them to choose their roommates. In Paris, students stay in a hotel for two nights.

The tour includes language and history classes in Cadiz, Spain and Nice, France. They will visit museums and see the history come alive through the arts.

Winter Weather Ahead!

Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs before 6:30 a.m. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

Decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family. Families are encouraged to use transit or have students walk.
