Príncipal's Message

As we work our way through January and the end of the first semester there are dates and events that students and parents should be aware of. Below is important information about course timetables, altered schedule for the three days of the semester and provincial exam/numeracy assessment week.

- Grade 11/12 students were given an opportunity last week to request online a course change for second semester. The only changes that counsellors and administration were considering were changes for graduation or post-secondary requirements. As we communicated last spring there is very little ability to make changes once course selection is finalized in June.
- There will not be an opportunity for Grade 9/10 students to request course changes. If there are extenuating circumstances parents can contact their child's vice principal.
- All students will get a copy of their second semester timetable on Wednesday January 17th in PACK. Students may have had slight changes to their timetable even if they didn't request a change as counsellors and administrators balanced classes for second semester.
- Grade 12 students should be working through their Grad Transitions portfolio. We will be having an afternoon in April for Grade 12 students to meet with a teacher and do their exit interview as the final step in the Grad transitions program. More information will be shared with Grade 12 students in upcoming PACK classes.

Our school schedule will look different for students starting this Thursday January 18th and continuing until Monday January 22nd. We are running double block classes where the blocks are longer for teachers to have final presentations, final exams etc. Please see the schedule below:

SUBSTANCE USE SERVICES EDUCATION SERIES - Winter 2018 A Free Group - Open to the Public

SHARE Substance Use Services invites you to attend any or all of our Education Series. The program is open to everyone in the community. It offers important information for those who are struggling with substance misuse or are concerned about their use. It will also help those people affected by others' substance use. There is no cost for this group. Topics will vary from week to week as outlined below. The format consists of a slide show presentation, video and discussion.

Jan. 25, 2018 - Use; misuse; abuse. Gain a better understanding of substance use.

Feb. 1, 2018 - Medical aspects and effects of substance use: What happens to the body and mind under the influence.

Feb. 8, 2018 - Substance Affected: How others' misuse of substances can affect us and how to support them.

Feb. 15, 2018 - Alcohol: How dependence develops; intoxicated driving; and effects during pregnancy.

Feb. 22, 2018 - Marijuana: A second-class addiction?

March 1, 2018 - Opiates: Fentanyl, heroin & other commonly used depressants ~ addiction, safety and recovery.

March 8, 2018 - Stimulants: Cocaine, crystal meth & others ~ short term recovery and long-term recovery.

March 15, 2018 - Trauma & substance use: The relationship between trauma and substance use.

March 22, 2018 - Anger: Understanding anger and learning how to respond to it more effectively.

March 29, 2018 - Stress: Learning how to cope without using substances.

April 5, 2018 - Relapse Prevention: The psychological, emotional and physical aspects of relapse and how to respond. April 12, 2018 - Mental Illness: depression, anxiety and addiction. Understanding the links between mental illness and substance use.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m**. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

Decisions to stay at home during challenging weather conditions should be made by each family. Families are encouraged to use transit or have students walk.
