

THE CORE COMPETENCIES AND SELF-ASSESSMENT

Core Competencies are sets of intellectual, personal and social-emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep and life-long learning. They fall into three categories: thinking, communication and personal and social. Teachers have always engaged and supported the Core Competencies; now the intent is to make this hidden curriculum intentional and help students gain the ability to assess their own strengths, provide evidence and examples, outline achievable and realistic goals and construct a clear plan to reach them.

The Core Competencies are not evaluated by the teacher; each student assesses their individual strengths and sets goals for growth and improvement. In PACK this year, as well as in many classrooms, students have been practicing the skill of self-assessment. For the June report card, we are mandated to have Grade 9 students report on their self-assessment of the core competencies. A committee of teachers is currently planning how that will look for the students and how that information will be communicated with you, the parents. Please look for some kind of notification in your Grade 9 and 10 students' report cards.

PINETREE'S GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES' STUDENTS VISIT TO LAOS AND VIETNAM



The Pinetree Global Perspectives students had a successful visit to Laos and Vietnam in March for three weeks after months preparing and raising awareness and funds for their humanitarian trip to Laos. This year the project focused heavily on education, and the students spent six days at two high schools in a rural area. Funds were raised to provide the schools with classroom fans and sports equipment. While in Laos, the students taught English, built barbed-wire fences, painted a building at one of the schools, as well as sanded, and fixed up desks and chairs at the other.







In addition to their work at these schools, the Global Perspectives class made donations to a mobile floating library which services remote areas in Laos, a Children's Cultural Centre in Luang Prabang, and to the COPE Rehabilitation Centre that helps victims of exploded ordinance bombs. In addition, they visited with students at a more affluent high school and toured a vocational training institute in Vientiane, the capitol of Laos. They also met some amazing diplomats at the Canadian Embassy in Hanoi, and Canadian Consular office in Vientiane.

According to Alyssa Lee, "our short, but deeply inspiring, time at the school, was humbling and eye-opening. Although there was a language barrier, the teaching sessions were accompanied by genuine smiles. This experience provided us with a lens into the lives of people our age on the other side of the globe, and reminded us that we share many traits as teenagers. We observed that a special kind of wealth comes with having strong relationships that one cannot put a monetary value on."

Many thanks to the staff and students at Pinetree Secondary, as well as the staff and students at Bramblewood, Glen, Panorama, Pinetree Way, and Walton Elementary, and Summit Middle, for their support of our project initiatives. A special thanks also to Hazel Postma, a CUSO cooperant who worked in Laos for six months, for facilitating our visits in Vientiane.

E-cigarettes, what are they and why you should be concerned?

One of the growing trends amongst young teenagers is the fad of e-cigarettes. The plume of

vapour seen from afar is the first clue. As one gets closer the smell of Vanilla, Cotton Candy, Cinnamon Funnel Cake, Honey Dew Melon, or Berry Blast hits your nostrils. The scent lingers in the air and is extremely obvious to the casual observer. This fad among teenagers is quite prevalent and has the same addictive qualities as traditional cigarettes. E-juice is sold in the bottle and can range in volume and price. 15 ml will cost \$13 while the 60 ml can cost as



much as \$60. Nicotine content can vary in e-juice but can be as high as 25%.



Vaporizers have been banned from schools; however, several are confiscated each month. They come in different shapes, sizes, and colours and can range in price from \$50 -\$300. Although mainly designed for nicotine products higher end models have the ability to handle Marijuana concentrates.

The Juul vaporizer looks like a USB flash drive. It even charges when plugged into a laptop. It is small enough to fit inside an enclosed hand. One Juul pod contains as much nicotine as a pack of cigarettes, and comes with flavors like crème brulee, mango and fruit medley.





The Aspire Breeze is another vaporizer that has been confiscated on school grounds and is small enough to fit into an enclosed hand. Both the Juul and the Breeze are easy to

conceal and emit very little vapour. Lastly, students have been found in possession of the Nicorette Spray. The spray is dispensed



under the tongue providing students with an instant hit of nicotine. Students have reported that three blasts of the spray is the maximum dose. The spray can be purchased from most drug stores at a cost of approximately \$35.

Health Effects of Nicotine and E-cigarettes— New studies report that E-cigarette vapor contain dangerous levels of toxic metals including lead, chromium and manganese. These substances raise the risk of cancer, heart disease and brain damage. Nicotine found in the Vape Juice is highly addictive and adversely affects the heart, reproductive system, lungs and kidneys. Immediate effects are increase in pulse rate, blood pressure and increased rate of respiration.
