Principal's Message

Dear Pinetree Families:

As we move through the month of May it is hard to believe that we have less than two months of this school year left. May is a busy month for us at Pinetree. Students and teachers are working hard at racing towards the finish line in all of our courses. This month we have AP exams happening for a number of grade 12 students. Our graduating students are really beginning to get excited about all of the graduation events coming up. (More about Grad in the grad section of this newsletter). A tradition at Pinetree for the last number of years has been in the spring to celebrate each grade. This involves each grade having a day where at lunch the leadership students, administrators and teachers hand out a treat at lunch. We have already had our Grade 9 and Grade 10 days and our Grade 11 day is May 28 and Grade 12 day on June 5th. Later this month our grade 12 students will help us pick the graduating classes Valedictorian.

ENGLISH 12 AND COMMUNICATIONS 12 PROVINCIAL EXAMS

Attention Grade 12's! In order to graduate with a Dogwood Diploma, you **MUST** write the English 12 or Communications 12 Provincial Exam. All students currently taking either English 12 or Comm. 12 will be registered for the Provincial Exam.

English 12 – Monday June 24th 8:30 am Communications 12 – Wednesday June 26th 8:30 am

Students who missed the Exam Re-Write Session in April, but still wish to take the English 12 or Communications 12 Provincial Exam, **MUST** see Ms. Applewhite to register by the **Friday May 10th** deadline.

NUMERACY ASSESSMENT JUNE 2019

All current Grade 11 Math Students who have not already written the Provincial Numeracy Assessment (REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION) are registered to write this June. E-exam sessions are set for Monday June 24th (PM) and Tuesday June 25th (AM and PM). Dates and times specifying when students are writing will be posted on the front Main Office window on Monday June 10th. Students must check to confirm the date, time and location of their Numeracy E-exam. Should Students have questions or concerns, please see Ms. Applewhite.

The Re-write for Grade 12 Students was on April 25th. Students were given 4 weeks to sign up. If you are in Grade 12 and you have not yet written the Numeracy Provincial Exam, you <u>MUST</u> see Ms. Applewhite to register by **Friday May 10th**. This is the last opportunity to write the Exam this school year. <u>Grade 12 Students</u> <u>are required to write the Provincial Numeracy Exam for Graduation</u>.

GRADE 12 GRADUATION INFORMATION

At this time of year Pinetree's Grade 12 students are anxiously anticipating the year end activities around graduation. There is a lot of excitement around the planning for Grad Dinner and Dance, After Grad and Commencement. There are several things students must complete for graduation. One important piece is Graduation Transitions. Students must complete a number of projects to be able to graduate. At this time of year, most students have completed all the necessary activities/lessons to complete the requirement for Graduation Transitions. Students cannot purchase a ticket for the Grad Dinner and Dance if they have not completed their Graduation Transitions. We also have reminded students throughout the year that attending Grad events is a privilege and students who are struggling to respect our school's code of conduct may not be allowed to attend events.

Our hope is that every Grade 12 student will be able to cross the stage at commencement. Students who are graduating with a dogwood diploma will need to be successfully meeting all the graduation requirements to attend the Commencement ceremony. Students can also participate in Commencement if they are within two courses of graduation and they have a plan for summer school that has been discussed with their Vice Principal.

Lastly many Grads in years past have rented limousines or party buses to get to and from the Grad Dinner and Dance. As a school this is not something we have encouraged as this is often when students make poor choices around using drugs or alcohol before arriving at the event. The Provincial government has put in new regulations for the operators of these vehicles. Below are two links to articles in the Vancouver Sun and CTV news about the changes:

The hotel where the grad dinner and dance is being held has private security and they are very thorough in checking our students before they are allowed into the venue. Unfortunately, every year some students make poor choices and are turned away at the hotel by the private security. Please talk to your child about making good choices on this special evening and not risking their attendance at the Grad Dinner and Dance, After Grad and the Commencement Ceremony.

Five Science 10 Honours students wrote the Micheal Smith National Challenge which emphasizes logical thinking and covers material in the Science curriculum common to all provinces.


Sunny Liang placed 1st in BC and won \$100 for his achievement. Rick Hu was a close 2nd with only one point separating him and Sunny. Well Done!

DEVICE USE DURING CLASS TIME

In order to have student focus remain on education during class time, we are asking them to abide by the following guidelines:

- During class time devices should be for educational purposes only. That is, students should not be using their phones to watch movies, text, receive calls, etc. Students can place their phone upside down on their desk, in their jacket, or in their backpack.


