- a settlement located in the Creston Valley in S.E. B.C. (near Cranbrook) (2)

- made up of members of two polygamous (?) Mormon fundamentalists groups  
- named after "Bountiful" in the Book of Mormon

- the first member was Harold (aka) Michael Blackmore, who moved there with his family in 1946

- other members of the church who believed in the principles of plural marriages soon followed

- Winston Blackmore became the bishop in 1980's group took the name of Bountiful.

- currently about 1000 people → most descended from only a half a dozen men

- Bountiful - the subject of numerous investigations since the 1990's → sexual abuse + child trafficking
- 13 alleged instances → underage girls from Bountiful taken to the U.S. to marry older men

## The Tyee "Leaving Bountiful" Nov. 18/2004

Someone who  
left. How?

- Jane Blackmore - "I was there for the [sexual] needs of my husband, and that was about it."
- Strength to leave - from friends who "just let me know that they were my friends no matter what"
