Coquitlam Foundation Scholarships

Eligibility:

- General eligibility requirements require applicants to:
- Demonstrate financial need
- Demonstrate a history of school and community service and leadership OR school and community involvement
- Demonstrate academic success sufficient to enter into post-secondary studies
- Begin designated studies within three years of formal notification of awarded bursary/scholarship
- Submit a written report upon completion of the applicable term of studies

BC Excellence Scholarships – Nomination Process

Value: 55 @ \$5,000

Pinetree can nominate one student. You must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident.

The B.C. Excellence scholarship is awarded to 55 high school graduates who have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and who show aptitude for and commitment to their chosen career or area of post-secondary study.

Eligibility requirements:

Students selected as conditional recipients of the B.C. Excellence scholarship must meet the following requirements **by August 31** of their graduating year to be confirmed as a recipient and receive their scholarship voucher:

- [meet core eligibility requirements](#);
- be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma);
- fulfill the [requirements of the B.C. Graduation Program](#); and,
- have the following final marks.
 - Minimum "B" average in grades 11 and 12 courses required for graduation
 - Minimum "B" (73% or above) in Language Arts 12
 - Minimum "B" average, no more than one "C+" (67% or above), and no marks lower than "C+" in courses that fulfill graduation requirements for Science 11 or 12, Math 11, and Social Studies 11 or 12

Western University National Scholarship Program – Nomination Process

Value: \$2,500-\$100,000

Pinetree Secondary School can nominate up to 4 students and 1 additional international student.

Eligibility: With the exception of the International President's Entrance Scholarships and the President's Entrance Scholarship. For Black Students, National Scholarship applicants must be Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada. All applicants must have obtained a minimum overall average of 90% on all Grade 12 courses. National Scholarships are available only at Western's main campus, and Faculty Entrance Scholarships are available only within the faculty] for which the scholarship has been awarded. Value: 50 @ \$120,000 for engineering scholarships / 50 @ \$100,000 for science & math scholarships

Criteria:

- Must be a Canadian citizen. A permanent resident cannot apply.
- Plan to enroll in an eligible STEM program at one of the listed partner universities.
- Be entrepreneurial-minded and plan to enroll in an eligible STEM program at one of their partner universities listed at the link below.
- Must meet the following criteria: Academic excellence AND leadership, charisma and creativity.
- Strong consideration will be given to students with financial need.
- Must be entrepreneurial minded and intend to pursue a career in one of the following areas: technology, engineering, entrepreneurship, and business enterprise, or applied scientific research.

Not considering students who:

- Focus on activism (environmental/political/societal).
- Planning a career as a physician and/or medical researcher. This includes doctor, dentist, nurse, psychologist, pharmacist, optometrist, etc.
- Intend on becoming a professor and conduct theoretical research.

- Must be a BC resident
- Have lived in Canada for a minimum of 7 years
- Plan to graduate from a BC secondary school
- Plan to attend and study full time at a university, college, or trade school
- Be ineligible for the BC Tuition Waiver Program (for former youth in care)
- Have experienced adversity or hardship
- Have exhibited a good work ethic
- Have demonstrated financial need
- Evidence of leadership involvement

SFU Ugglu Family Scholarship for Domestic Students - Aprox. \$140,000 Value

Criteria and Eligibility:

- Domestic (Canadian) student admitted to fall term to any undergraduate degree
- Student must be facing significant financial barriers to participate in post-secondary
- May include students who identify as Indigenous, Black, or person of colour, students living with disabilities, LGBTQIA2S+ students, and students of all gender identities.

- The award recognizes outstanding students who demonstrate leadership, community engagement, and resilience while facing financial barriers.

The intent of this scholarship is to promote equity and remove historical and existing discrimination, including barriers to full participation in social, cultural, economic, and political life.

10 awards covering: All tuition & fees, on-campus housing/meal plan, textbooks, other materials and more...

Deadline to apply is Jan. 19, 2026.

Certificate in Essential Technical Skills for Architecture, Construction & Engineering (“ACE Certificate”) – for Graduating Students

The ACE Certificate is a 14-month career exploration program, running from July 2026-August 2027.

The funded ACE Summer Intensive classes are held at the BCIT Burnaby Campus. Students must Complete all three courses to continue to the second segment of the program that will run from Sept. 7, 2026 to Aug. 27, 2027. It includes two practicums and 5 online courses.
