The purpose of this letter is to inform you of this proposed extra-curricular field trip involving your child, and to seek your support and written permission for your child to participate. Please note that participation in this activity is strictly voluntary.

The Kilometer Club is back! Derek Passaglia , our Principal, is the staff sponsor for this activity. Roger Boon and Jacquie Hutchinson (parent volunteers) will be this year's coordinators. We would like to encourage you and your children to join us once per week for some fresh air and exercise! Our goal is to have as many Porter students, grandparents and parents as possible running or walking around Como Lake once a week. We will keep track of all kilometers traveled individually and as a group. Running and walking are wonderful lifetime fitness activities and "healthy body equals healthy mind"!

The club will be open to ALL Porter students (and staff) as well as to any parents/guardians who wish to improve their fitness in a fun and supportive environment. The KM Club will operate on a "drop-in" basis every Tuesday beginning on Tuesday September 13 th 2016

We will meet in the gym at 2:55 p.m. for attendance and stretching then walk as a group to Como Lake via Cornell Avenue. Students will be given pinnies to wear. We will start off slowly and gradually build up our stamina. The first few times we will run/walk gradually build up to a 50 minute workout. Each child will receive a popsicle stick for each completed lap. At the end of the workout students return their pinnies and Popsicle sticks. Students will then follow a cool down routine before they are dismissed.

Safety is of utmost concern to us. Each student will wear a pinnie. The laps will be recorded on the attendance/sign out sheets. All children must be picked up and gl bYX ci hVUW at 9W YPorter's North Parking Lot at 4:10 PM.

Sometimes KM Club can be cancelled due to severe weather. Check the school website (http://www.sd43.bc.ca/elementary/porter) each Tuesday to see if KM Club is on or not.

School District #43 (Coquitlam) has the requirement that student field trips meet a minimum child to adult ratio. For primary grades (K, 1, 2, and 3) the ratio is 1 adult for every 6 children. For the intermediate grades (4 and 5) the ratio is 1 adult for every 8 children. In order for KM Club to run each week, we must adhere to these ratios. If we don't have committed volunteers we won't have a KM Club. This is a very popular activity, so you can see how important you are to its success.
