Porter Elementary School, has invited the popular *Math Mania* program to the school for an evening event. We are pleased to be able to come to the school on Wednesday, November 16, 2016. The event will be held in the gymnasium from 6:30 to 8:00 pm. In order to hold the event, there will be about twenty volunteers – students, faculty and staff – coming from Douglas College that evening as well as the people from Pacific Institute of the Mathematical Sciences educational outreach. We look forward to meeting you and your children at the school on November 16.

#### What is Math Mania?

Math Mania is a popular alternative math educational event which has been presented in some of the elementary schools in the Greater Victoria, Lower Mainland and other areas of the Province- the events have been held since 1997. Events are put on four or five times a year and are open to all students in the school. Although we welcome all age levels, it is particularly suited to grade one to five students. Math Mania is free and open to the public. It is sponsored by PIMS (Pacific Institute for the Mathematical Sciences) as part of its educational outreach program.

Math Mania presents a variety of interactive demonstrations, puzzles, games and art these can include building polyhedral, matchstick puzzles, the penny game, the Set Game, Pig. Tower of Hanoi, error detection algorithms and building hexaflexagons, and a number of mathematical puzzles and paradoxes. These activities are designed to demonstrate to students - and their parents - through hands-on activities fun ways of learning both math and computer science concepts.

## **Dogs on Porter School Property**

We recognize and appreciate that dogs are significant and loved members of some of our families and that parents and caregivers, often during the morning walk to school and the afternoon walk back home, exercise their dogs.

We need to balance this with the acknowledgement that not all of our school community members (students and/or adults) are comfortable with dogs.

Therefore, please, when dropping off and picking up your child:

- Other than school drop-off and school pick-up of students, dogs are not to be on school property
- ALL dogs MUST be leashed AT ALL TIMES and under the direct control of the owner
- DO NOT tie up your dog and leave unattended at any time
- ALL dogs MUST remain outside the school
- Dogs and their owners MUST NOT block entrances to and exits from our school
- Please keep your dog well away from our school entrances/exits
- Please keep your dog well away from our school playgrounds
- DO NOT wait with your dog on or next to paths where students enter and exit our school property
- Dogs should NEVER be off leash
- Dog owners MUST clean up their dog's feces and any residue
- Please report any concerns to the office

While it is difficult for school staff to supervise school property usage during the evenings and weekends, the City of Coquitlam Bylaw Office has been contacted to help monitor school grounds during these times.

The staff at Porter Elementary School is working hard to ensure a safe and caring school environment and with your cooperation we hope to continue to work with all of our community members.



#### **RECYCLING AT PORTER**

Our Porter students and staff are committed to reducing our carbon footprint - to make a positive difference in helping our beautiful planet, Earth.

#### Did you know:

- ♦ That all students and staff are encouraged to recycle their: organics; plastics and juice boxes
- ♦ That we established Porter's first Student Organic Waste, Juice Boxes and Plastics Recycling Team made up of Grade 3, 4 and 5 students
- ♦ This team of dedicated, passionate and caring students:
  - Have set of six stations for students and staff to recycle their items; three stations in our north wing and three stations in our south wing
  - ♦ Each station has three plastic containers lined with green biodegradable bags; one container is for organic waste; one container is for juice boxes; and one container is for plastics
  - Then, every Tuesday and Friday (or last day of the week) at recess, our Recycling Team empties the containers in each of our six stations into larger bins located by our gym and re-lines each container with new green biodegradable bags; the contents of these larger bins are recycled when they are full
  - ◆ This past week our Recycling Team introduced a new recycling program to our school, Return-It School; we welcomed 'RETURN-IT SUPER-HERO' to Porter this past Wednesday morning for an assembly; RETURN-IT SUPER-HERO' taught our school about why we recycle and how important it is!
  - ◆ You will now find six Return-It Recycling Containers located throughout our school; they look like this:

#### These containers can accept:

- Juice boxes (tetra-packs)
- Plastics
- Aluminum cans
- ORGANICS <u>DO NOT</u> GO IN THESE CONTAINERS









#### **THANK YOU PORTER PAC!**

You probably have noticed several new additions to our north playground since the school year began,. These items include: 9 log benches, 6 large boulders, 3 new trees and 3 large metal troughs. These items are part of the last phases of our PAC's North Playground Revitalization Project. In the Spring of 2017 we will have the final two phases completed; this includes the laying of some new grass at the west side of the new blacktop area and the 'cleaning up' of the gravel path between our swings and playground.

This will bring our PAC's North Playground Revitalization Project to an end.

Plans are already being discussed for the next phase of our grounds revitalization; the tentative discussions include: new blacktop around our gym on the back (west) side of our school; the repainting of our blacktop games (four-square, hop-scotch,

etc); several new tetherball poles; and two basketball courts - there have been no final decisions made.
