WINTER WEATHER IS STILL WITH US!

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs before 6:30 a.m. so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website www.sd43.bc.ca and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.

PRESENTERS

Robb McGirr is an addictions counselor at Front-Line Prevention Services specializing in school-based prevention and early intervention. He is a consultant for the school district working under the direction of the district's student wellness and safety portfolio. Robb has a long history with both our schools and community having worked as a Port Moody police officer for 20 years, and a youth substance-use prevention specialist for the last 11 years.





SHARE Family & Community Services is a non-profit agency that provides a wide variety of programs and services in the community. SHARE is the primary resource for substance use prevention and intervention in the Tri-Cities, Belcarra and Anmore. There are two health promotion facilitators that have many years of experience. They provide evidence-based, leading edge prevention programs in the schools throughout the year. The SHARE youth substance use program also have clinical counsellors who provide free individual counselling services for youth aged 12 to 24.



Dogs on Porter School Property

We recognize and appreciate that dogs are significant and loved members of some of our families and that parents and caregivers, often during the morning walk to school and the afternoon walk back home, exercise their dogs.

We need to balance this with the acknowledgement that not all of our school community members (students and/or adults) are comfortable with dogs.

Therefore, please, when dropping off and picking up your child:

- Other than school drop-off and school pick-up of students, dogs are not to be on school property
- ALL dogs MUST be leashed AT ALL TIMES and under the direct control of the owner
- DO NOT tie up your dog and leave unattended at any time
- ALL dogs MUST remain outside the school
- Dogs and their owners MUST NOT block entrances to and exits from our school
- Please keep your dog well away from our school entrances/exits
- Please keep your dog well away from our school playgrounds
- DO NOT wait with your dog on or next to paths where students enter and exit our school property
- Dogs should NEVER be off leash
- Dog owners MUST clean up their dog's feces and any residue
- Please report any concerns to the office

While it is difficult for school staff to supervise school property usage during the evenings and weekends, the City of Coquitlam Bylaw Office has been contacted to help monitor school grounds during these times.

The staff at Porter Elementary School is working hard to ensure a safe and caring school environment and with your cooperation we hope to continue to work with all of our community members.
