#### **Opening Week Schedule for Grades 1 to 5 students:**

#### **Tuesday, September 5:**

All 2017-2018 Grade 1-5 students will attend school from 10:00 am to 10:30 am. Grades 1-5 students are to <u>meet their previous year's</u> teacher where they normally lined up last school year.

At 10:30 am: Grade 1 to 5 students will be brought back to where they lined up at 10:00 am and will be dismissed to their parent.

Teachers will let children know what supplies they should bring to school for the next few days, if any.

#### New Students and Families to Porter:

New Grades 1 to 5 students and families are asked to come to our office. You will be met by our Teachers, Ms. Turpin and Ms. Mcdowell, and escorted to Room 12. On Wed Sept 6 our new students are to report to Room 12. They will, then, be brought to classrooms to meet and be with same age peers during the first week. To pick your child up at the end of the day please ask at the office.

#### Wednesday, September 6 to Friday, September 8 (possibly, into the second week):

#### KINDERGARTEN GRADUAL ENTRY PROCESS Tues Sept 5 – Fri Sept 15, 2017

The school year begins Tuesday, September 5, 2017 for our new Kindergarten students.

On Tuesday, September 5, our new Kindergarten students will attend school from 8:50 am to 9:30 am to confirm your child's attendance. Please take your child to the exterior door of the classroom of the teacher your child has been assigned to. These doors will be clearly marked on the classroom windows or walls.

- If your child has been assigned to **English Kindergarten** with Ms. Taylor Lepore please: line up at the south exterior doors against the south-west exterior wall
- If your child has been assigned to French Immersion Kindergarten with Mme Anita Bell please: line up at the south exterior doors against the south-east exterior wall
- If your child has been assigned to **French Immersion Kindergarten** with Mme Diane Squeo (M-Th) and Mme Constanta Rosu (F) please: line up at Mme Squeo's and Mme Rosu's exterior classroom door located in the middle of the east side of our south wing of classrooms adjacent to our primary playground

There will be staff and signs to direct you to the correct location. Your child will be at school for only 40 minutes on Tues Sept 5 so that we can say hello, welcome your child and take attendance. **THEREFORE, PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE THE SCHOOL.** Your child will be dismissed at 9:30 am.

# **REMINDER: Porter is a Nut Aware School**

September 2017

Dear Porter Street Parents/Guardians,

The number of Porter students with life-threatening allergies has been growing each year and is significant. Though students within this group are allergic to a number of foods, the most common food allergy is to **nuts (peanuts and tree nuts)**. District Administrative Procedure 315 – Anaphylaxis in Schools states that *the Principal must attempt to reduce the child's exposure to allergic foods within the school setting*.

In the past, one measure we have taken to do this has been to ask you to send only nut-free products to our bake sales, not because allergic students would be eating those products (as safety dictates that they eat only food provided by their parents) but to minimize their exposure to allergens.

In the past few years, we have gone from having just two or three nut-free classrooms to having more than half the classrooms in the school being nut-free.

#### Since we have:

- monitors moving between classes at lunch-time,
- children with nuts in their lunch eating in the hall outside the office,
- nut-allergic children who could have a life-threatening anaphylactic reaction simply from touching a surface that has traces
  of nuts on it and,
- a high prevalence of nut allergies in the school we feel it prudent to do more to protect our allergic students.

Therefore, we are reminding all of you, the parents and guardians of our school community students, for your support and cooperation. All students (and staff) will be asked to bring to school only food free of peanuts and tree nuts. We ask you to read food labels and check for peanut/nut ingredients (including oils) prior to sending food to school. If you have caregivers who provide your child(ren) with lunches or snacks, we encourage you to share this information letter with them. Also please instruct your children that they are not to share food with other students and that they are to wash their hands before and after eating. Though we cannot guarantee a nut free school, we can work together to be nut aware to help keep our allergic students safe.

Slip-ups may happen, despite the best intentions. A child inadvertently bringing nut products to school will be provided with an alternate snack/lunch from emergency supplies, and the nut-containing food will be sent home to enjoy later.

We realize this request to be nut aware may require added planning and effort on your part when preparing your child's lunches and snacks. We wish to express our sincere appreciation for your support and cooperation in these potentially life-saving measures.

Dog feces can transmit disease - PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG!

Please remember and be mindful that some of our students and adults are scared of dogs; that not all of our school community members are comfortable with dogs – PLEASE

KEEP YOUR DOG ON A LEASH AND IN CONTROL AT ALL TIMES!

EVEN LOUD DOG-BARKING CAN SCARE SOME STUDENTS AND ADULTS – if you own such a vocal dog please keep your dog a safe distance from our students, undercover areas, especially our adventure play areas.

While it is difficult for school staff to supervise school property usage during the evenings and weekends, the

City of Coquitlam Bylaw Office has been contacted to help monitor school grounds during these times.

The staff at Porter Elementary School will continue to work hard to ensure a safe and caring school environment.

Through the combined efforts of SD43 Coquitlam and the City of Coquitlam a pilot dog signage program was implemented at both Parkland Elementary and Porter Elementary Schools last Spring 2017.

# NEW DOG SIGNAGE installed last Spring 2017

The purpose of the signage is meant to articulate and clarify both City of Coquitlam Animal *Care and Control Bylaw* and SD43 Coquitlam and City of Coquitlam expectations with respect to dogs on school grounds during school hours and after school hours.

The signage was installed on our perimeter fencing along both MacIntosh St and Grover Ave. In addition, we had signage put up along several points at the front of our school along Porter St.

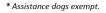
# Students/Children Play Here

**NO DOGS ALLOWED** on school district property during school days from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with the exception of:

- Assistance dogs.
- Dogs with a parent/guardian during student drop-off and pick-up.

#### AT ALL TIMES, ALL DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY MUST BE:

- Licensed.
- Cleaned up after and have their waste removed.
- Leashed and under adult control.\*
- Kept away from buildings, entrances and play areas.\*

Individuals must adhere to City of Coquitlam Animal Care and Control Bylaw 4240, 2011 Section 10.7

Every owner of an animal, other than a special needs assistance animal, while in a public place must obey all posted signs that apply to that animal, including, without limitation, all signs restricting or prohibiting entry by dogs onto private property.

Failure to adhere to posted signs could result in fines.

#### **Parenting Wisely Course**



Parenting Wisely is a free course about managing the behaviour of elementary school children. Topics include waiting patiently until conversations or phone calls are over, morning and bedtime routines, cooperating with friends and peers, behaving in public and schoolwork challenges. Two Parenting Wisely courses are being presented by Stan Simister and Porter Street Elementary School.

One course starts Tuesday October 3, 2017, from 9:30am to 11:30am. This course will run for 7 consecutive Tuesdays and ends on November 14, 2017. A second course starts Wednesday October 4, 2017, from 9:30am to 11:30am. This course will run for 7 consecutive Wednesdays and ends on November 15, 2017.

Both courses will be held at Porter Street Elementary School, 728 Porter St., Coquitlam. You need to attend the first class to take either course. Please register with the school office, between Monday September 18, 2017 and Friday September 29, 2017, at telephone # 604-936-4296. If you are unable to attend the first class you will not be able to take these courses, but you are welcome to register for the Parenting Wisely courses that will be offered again in January of 2018.

#### THE FIRST WEEK OF SCHOOL

Below is information to help you and your family start this 2017-2018 school year.

At this time of year parents often have questions about school organization, class placements and opening day procedures for the start of school in September. The purpose of this section is to provide parents with information on:

- School organization and student enrolment
- Blended classes
- · Class placement of students

#### **School Organization and Student Enrolment:**

All elementary schools are allocated staffing by the school district based upon projected student enrolment for September. This projection is completed and submitted at the end of March of the previous school year. The amount of staffing allocated is set by the School Board once the Ministry of Education approves the School Board's submitted budget for the school year. Since staffing levels (how many teachers a school is given) depends on student enrolment, it is very important that schools hear from parents if their children will not be attending the same school again in September, or if families will be on extended holidays anytime in the first two weeks of school. Similarly, it is important for people moving into a school community to contact the school about registration as early as possible.

Our goal is to place students in their new class once we feel our student enrollment numbers are firm; if possible, we wish to avoid placing students in classes and then, after the fact, having to reorganize classes. As a result, the first week or two of school can present several challenges for organizing an elementary school, making up classes and placing new students. Our procedure for the first week (or two) of students returning to last year's teacher and classroom allows staff time to see which families may have moved out of Porter over the summer, check to find out why some students from last year have not shown up on the first day and continue to register students new to the school if space allows. Usually this process is completed by the end of the first week of school. It may, however, be extended by a few days in order to organize the school according to our student numbers.

#### **Blended Classes:**

Blended classes have students from two grades in one class. The realities of student enrolment, staffing allotments and Ministry of Education class size limits dictate that there will be blended classes at Porter Elementary and virtually all elementary schools across our School District. Regardless of whether your child is placed in a blended class or a straight-grade class, numerous studies indicate that students do equally well in either setting.

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#### **Class Placements:**

Your child's teacher last school year, along with other teachers your child may have had last year, consider many factors in the process of recommending a student's placement for this school year's class. This process is extremely thorough involving many hours of discussion and consultation. The focus is always on the educational needs of students which may include the following factors:

- · academic ability
- · work habits and attitude
- maturity
- learning style
- social relationship with peers
- academic relationship with peers

We trust this information will be helpful and increase understanding about some of the issues and realities of school organization and class placement. We also seek your cooperation and support for our start-up these first few weeks.

Our goal is to have students in their new classrooms as soon as possible.

We appreciate your patience and support at this time.

#### **LENGTH OF SCHOOL DAY & TIMETABLE FOR 2017-2018**

The legislated length of an instructional school day must be 293 minutes for Kindergarten to Grade 5.

#### We have four bells that ring each day. They are:

#### LINE UP BELL at 8:50 am

- students will have a designated outside location where they are to line up, daily; they will be greeted and brought
  into the school by their classroom teacher
- The day officially (Instructional Time) begins at 8:55 am and ends at 2:53 pm
- Recess will be 15 minutes in length; 10:35 10:50 am

#### **END OF RECESS BELL at 10:50 am**

- At this time, re-entry into our school depends on the teacher's practice; some teachers pick up their students at their outside location and some have their students simply enter the school on their own and make their way to class
- Instructional Time begins at 10:50 am

Noon-hour: **EAT TIME (12:05 - 12:20 pm)**; there is no 12:05 pm noon bell

12:20 PM BELL: INDICATES TIME TO GO OUTSIDE Noon-hour: PLAY TIME (12:20 - 12:50 pm)

#### LINE UP/ENTRY BELL at 12:50 pm

Instructional Time begins at 12:55 pm

# **Our annual Terry Fox Run will be held on** Friday, September 29, 2017



### **REMINDER: PICKING UP YOUR CHILD**

It is very important that children be picked up **on time each day**. Plan a meeting place for you and your child. Please show your child the meeting place and make sure she/he understands to wait there for you or an older brother or sister

#### Any student not picked up MUST make her/his way to the office; please review this with your child.
