
We had sales of \$4352.40 at the book fair!!



Parenting Wisely Course



Parenting Wisely is a free course about managing the behaviour of elementary school children. Topics include waiting patiently until conversations or phone calls are over, morning and bedtime routines, cooperating with friends and siblings, behaving in public and schoolwork challenges. Two Parenting Wisely courses are being presented by Stan Simister and Porter Street Elementary School.

One course starts **Tuesday April 17, 2018, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This course will run for 7 consecutive Tuesdays and ends on May 29, 2018. A second course starts **Wednesday April 18, 2018, from 9:30am to 11:30am**. This course will run for 7 consecutive Wednesdays and ends on May 30, 2018.





- if you witness a violation, call the RCMP immediately when the violation is occurring; this way the RCMP or the City of Coquitlam Bylaws Department can be dispatched and, hopefully, catch the driver committing the offence and can either educate them or issue violation tickets; in addition, the driver will know what the infraction was at the time of the offence, rather than us showing up days later to warn them.

- Our NORTH PARKING LOT has a drop-off and pick-up lane; this is the lane adjacent to the yellow-painted curb-blocks; PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR WHILE DROPPING-OFF OR PICKING UP YOUR CHILD – you MUST remain in your car













DOGS ON PORTER SCHOOL PROPERTY

Dog feces can transmit disease - PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG!

Please remember and be mindful that some of our students and adults are scared of dogs; that not all of our school community members are comfortable with dogs – PLEASE

KEEP YOUR DOG ON A LEASH AND IN CONTROL AT ALL TIMES!

EVEN LOUD DOG-BARKING CAN SCARE SOME STUDENTS AND ADULTS – if you own such a vocal dog please keep your dog a safe distance from our students, undercover areas, especially our adventure play areas.

While it is difficult for school staff to supervise school property usage during the evenings and weekends, the

City of Coquitlam Bylaw Office has been contacted to help monitor school grounds during these times.

The staff at Porter Elementary School will continue to work hard to ensure a safe and caring school environment.

Through the combined efforts of SD43 Coquitlam and the City of Coquitlam a pilot dog signage program was implemented at both Parkland Elementary and Porter Elementary Schools last Spring 2017.

NEW DOG SIGNAGE installed last Spring 2017

The purpose of the signage is meant to articulate and clarify both City of Coquitlam Animal *Care and Control Bylaw* and SD43 Coquitlam and City of Coquitlam expectations with respect to dogs on school grounds during school hours and after school hours.

The signage was installed on our perimeter fencing along both MacIntosh St and Grover Ave. In addition, we had signage put up along several points at the front of our school along Porter St.

Students/Children Play Here

NO DOGS ALLOWED on school district property during school days from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. with the exception of:

- Assistance dogs.
- Dogs with a parent/guardian during student drop-off and pick-up.

AT ALL TIMES, ALL DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY MUST BE:

- Licensed.
- Cleaned up after and have their waste removed.
- Leashed and under adult control.*
- Kept away from buildings, entrances and play areas.*
 - * Assistance dogs exempt.




Individuals must adhere to City of Coquitlam Animal Care and Control Bylaw 4240, 2011 Section 10.7

Rights and Responsibilities

I have the RIGHT to learn in this School.

It is my RESPONSIBILITY to follow instructions, remain on task, and not interfere with the learning of others.

I have the **RIGHT** to hear and be heard.

It is my RESPONSIBILITY to not talk or make noises when others are speaking.

I have the **RIGHT** to be treated with respect in this school.

It is my **RESPONSIBILITY** to treat all others with respect.

I have the **RIGHT** to be safe from physical and verbal violence in this school.

It is my **RESPONSIBILITY** not to physically or verbally harm anyone else.

I have the **RIGHT** to privacy and to my own personal space. It is my **RESPONSIBILITY** to respect the personal space and property of others and to accept their right to privacy.

Acceptable Conduct

Responsible behaviour looks like this:

- · Dismiss yourself when the bell rings

In the washroom:

- · Flush the toilet
- · Wash your hands (with soap)

- A letter of verification from School District 43 from the school's administration (not a teacher) identifying the applicant as a Grade 5 student.
- Birth certificate or Care Card showing the student's age as of December 31, 2017.
- Proof of Coquitlam residency ie. Phone, Hydro, Cable, Gas bill or Property Tax Notice. (Note: Driver's license,
 Care cards and PO Boxes are not acceptable as proof of residency.)
