#### **Decathlon: December 8-12th**

- Monday: Door Decorating
  - o Classes have until Monday, December 8th, at midnight to decorate their classroom door. Submit a photo of your door to a Microsoft form that will be sent out to participating classes.
- Tuesday: Name That Song
  - Three 10-second snippets of Christmas songs will be played over the PA. On a Microsoft form that will be sent out, classes need to name the title of the song as well as who it's by.
  - o Accuracy is prioritized, then time (how fast the form was submitted).

York University – President's International Scholarship of Excellence (\$180,000) is open to international high school students (non-Canadian requiring a study permit) that are applying to York University. Applicants must demonstrate solidarity and leadership skills along with including a short answer response about benefits of a strong labour movement in Canada. **2026 CMOLIK Foundation Scholarship** (\$50,000) is open to Gr. 12 residents of BC (lived in Canada for at least 7 years) that plan to attend full-time at a post-secondary institution or college. Applicants must have faced adversity, be

ineligible or BC Tuition Waiver Program (for former youth in care), and have demonstrated financial need (total annual family income not exceeding \$80,000). To apply for this scholarship, you first <u>must be nominated by Port Moody Secondary</u>. Nomination forms can be found in PMSS Career Centre TEAMS, website, or Ms. Chang's office.
