

Join us on Saturday May 25, 2024 at 1 pm to listen to Archaeologist Rob Rondeau talk about the fascinating world of marine archaeology.



A JOURNEY THROUGH TIME & WATER

People have always lived beside the sea. Marine archaeology continues from the shoreline, exploring the depths beyond - studying the material culture left behind as people ventured into the oceans. Though its archaeological challenges may differ from those of terrestrial archaeology, marine archaeology shares many practices and concerns in common: excavation, preservation, and dealing responsibly with cultural claims. In this presentation marine archaeologist, Rob Rondeau will discuss how marine and terrestrial archaeology work together to give a more complete picture of the past. He'll also talk about how his career has progressed and share some anecdotes about what it's been like along the way, both above and below the water.

Rob Rondeau is a Ph.D. Candidate at Simon Fraser University. He is the recipient of the Joseph-Armand Bombardier Canada Graduate Scholarship (Ph.D.) and was named a Fellow of the Royal Canadian Geographic Society in 2012.

To officially start things off—on Thursday, June 13, from 5 to 9 pm—please come to our Reopening Night where visitors will be welcomed by traditional Coast Salish song and dance by Tsatsu Stalqayu Coastal Wolf Pack, plus remarks from invited speakers. Then, from Friday, June 14 through Sunday, June 16, we are hosting a full, extended weekend of familyfriendly fun for our <u>Reopening Weekend Celebrations</u>. Visitors will be treated to dance and music performances, hands-on workshops, staff tours, plus food trucks and half-priced admission.

The Museum's reopening in June will mark the successful completion of cutting-edge seismic upgrades to the iconic Great Hall, plus the revitalization and reinterpretation of displays of Northwest Coast Indigenous carvings, poles, weavings and other works from the past and present. The Department of Mathematics, SFU, is hosting their annual Summer Math Camp this year, at two different locations: SFU Burnaby, June 24th - 28th, 2024 and SFU Surrey, June 25th & 26th, 2024. All interested students are invited, but students from traditionally under-represented groups (women, aboriginal students, recent immigrants) are particularly encouraged.

The Camp is designed to provide students in grades 9 and 10, who have demonstrated a talent for mathematics, with a variety of enrichment activities in a fun and rewarding environment. However, we ask you to choose students who will not be taking their grade 10 exams during the week of their chosen camp.

Since space is limited, it may not be possible to invite all of those students who are nominated. Camp participants will be selected from those nominated, and the successful applicants will be informed through their teachers or the contact information given on the nomination form. Further information about the registration process and the payment method will be provided at that time.

Support from Simon Fraser University, the Canadian Mathematical Society (CMS) and the Pacific Institute for the Mathematical Sciences (PIMS) will enable us to cover the some of the food, events and other costs. However, a registration fee (\$100.00 for Burnaby camp, \$30.00 for Surrey camp) will be necessary to offset some of the expense. Some schools choose to cover the registration fees for nominated students, check with your school about this possibility, Additionally, please let us know if you have a keen, bright student who may require financial support to attend the camp, we can work with the school to alleviate the financial harrier.

In previous years similar camps were organized at many Canadian universities, including Simon Fraser. The students who attended expressed great satisfaction with the experience.
