OCTOBER 2024 TEACHER CONFERENCES

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION ASSESSMENTS – NEXT WEEK

The BC Ministry of Education requires students in B.C. to complete three assessments, required for graduation. Literacy 10 and Numeracy 10 are typically done in grade 10, and Literacy 12 is completed in the grade 12 year. If you are in grade 11 or 12, and haven't finished the Literacy 10 or Numeracy 10 assessment, you should be writing next week.

TRANSLINK

As Translink is increasingly busy, please keep the following in mind when you are taking public transit.

- Be mindful of where you are standing when the bus is coming to a stop. Moving away from the curb allows the driver to pull in safely.
- Remember that other students want to get on the bus. Pushing your way to the front of the line makes everything slower for everyone.

- With construction, the bus stop locations have changed. Check the signs or your app carefully to make sure that you’re at the right bus stop.
- Other bus riders may not want to hear your conversation—keep the volume down.
- You might miss the bus, or it might be full. Another one will be along soon.
- If you see something unusual when you’re on public transit, report it to a uniformed attendant, or text 87.77.77

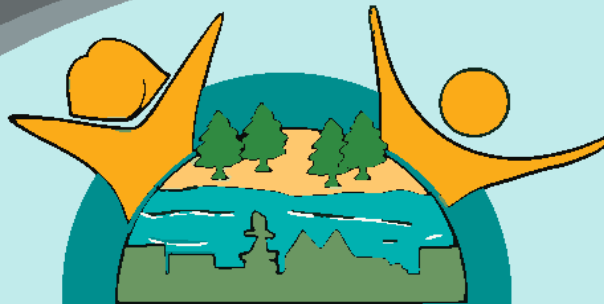

1. Join the Young Canadians' Parliament (YCP)

Children First Canada invites your students to participate in the Young Canadians' Parliament (YCP), a non-partisan 12-week civic education and leadership development program. YCP educates and empowers young people about their rights, Canada's political and democratic system, and nurtures their leadership skills. This program offers unique opportunities for youth to directly engage with Members of Parliament, Senators, and other Parliamentarians.

The YCP is a valuable experiential learning opportunity, closely aligning with the curriculum by fostering responsible and active civic participation. It welcomes youth under 18 from all abilities and backgrounds, regardless of prior experience.

2. You're Invited to National Child Day 2024!

This year's National Child Day (NCD) on November 20th offers students the chance to be educated and inspired by iconic Canadian leaders and organizations dedicated to helping children reach their full potential. Engaging students from early years, elementary, and secondary schools across Canada, the celebration will feature virtual field trips, creative workshops, book readings, and dance performances. Last year, nearly 40,000 students participated, making it the largest NCD in history!

This celebration, marking the 35th anniversary of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, is part of a movement to make Canada the best place for children to grow up.

This year's theme, #8MillionEmpowered, focuses on empowering all 8 million children in Canada by defending their rights, with a special focus on the rights of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit children and youth involvement in reconciliation.

Time: 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM ET

- Early Years (Kindergarten-Grade 3): A 30-minute program with a sing-along by Raffi, a virtual field trip to the Canadian Museum for Human Rights, a book reading by Onome Ako, and dancing with Gurdeep Pandher.
- Elementary (Grades 4-6): A 45-minute session featuring a book reading by Kim Spencer, creative activities with 6ix Academy, dance, and messages from special guests.
- Secondary (Grades 7-12): A one-hour event with a presentation by the Canadian Museum for Human Rights, an interview with the Young Canadians' Parliament, creative projects, and insights from young changemakers.
